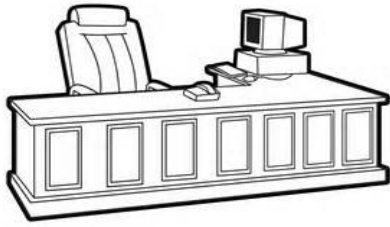

From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk "Parish Happening"

There is an old saying that things really slow down at a parish during the summer. That might be true at other parishes – especially those with a school – but here at Resurrection Parish, we have had a busy summer.

For the second summer in a row, Christina Fessler has offered an Art Camp for kids. She works with the kids on various art projects. This year they made masks, dream-catchers, sketches of their profile which they then colored in to represent their likes and values, some abstract paintings, ice cream cone sculptures, and other things. I know that the kids who participated had a lot of fun, and most of the classes were full. In fact we contemplated opening a second session for some of the more popular classes. It all cumulated in an Art Show in the atrium of the parish center on July 28. I stopped over and met our young artists and admired their work.

Also on July 28, the Holy Name Society sponsored a trip to see the Trenton Thunder minor league baseball team play. They had tickets in the picnic area, so there was also a lot of free food and drinks. Last Saturday, we dedicated our new St. Max Library. We had a good crowd after the 5 PM Mass, and everyone mentioned how much they liked the library, and that it looks very welcoming. I particularly liked the children's area. Starting in September we are going to have "Story Time" before some of the 10 AM Masses, where we will read a story to the kids. At the end of September we are going to have an "Author's Tea," with Robert Dunne who wrote 909 Days that Changed the World. The library will be open everyday, so it is a nice place to relax and read a book.

Finally, congratulations to Anthony Briggs, the grandson of Deacon Bill and Donna Briggs. Anthony participated in the Annual Shriners Children's Hospital Art Competition, and he won. That means that his painting won, so for this year it will be on the Shriners Hospital ties and scarfs that they give to donors. It is a beautiful tie and scarf, and we are very proud of Anthony. Reflect on the Word of Jesus Christ

Aug 7, 2016

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Being ready for Christ's return means doing what we've been instructed to do, living in the manner we've been taught. We are to do that every day, as if the master were already here with us, because in reality he is with us.

Fear, treasure, being prepared by practicing our Faith is the pattern for discipleship. Being without fear is a goal, knowing the source of your treasure -- that is, your identity, your worth -- makes it possible to be prepared for and an actual participant in God's kingdom.

We should probably begin this passage with the preceding verse, *which speaks of seeking the kingdom and receiving what one had been anxious about.* Certainly the opening verse sets the framework for what follows. God **wants** to give us the kingdom!

"Fear, treasure, and being prepared is the pattern for discipleship. Being without fear, knowing the source of your treasure, that is, your identity, your worth -- makes it possible to be prepared for and an actual participant in God's kingdom."



Get rid of your baggage, for your heavenly journey. Prepare your treasure in heaven by taking care of the needy, the ill, take care of our duties to you God by going to Mass and receiving the Eucharist, going to Reconciliation and doing ministry for Jesus in his Church.

Adult: So much baggage, I will start with Reconciliation.

Child: A treasure, from Jesus.....WOW, for me?

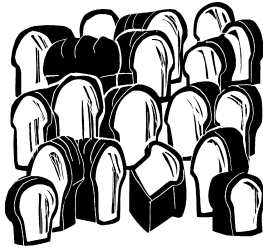


WAY TO GO!!

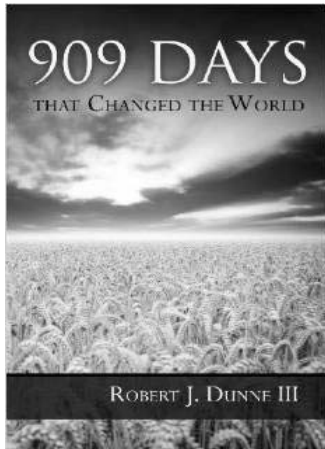

The final phase of the fundraiser for our Youth Ministry is almost over. You have less than a month to place an order that will be delivered to your home when it is convenient for you.

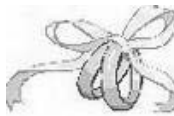

As important as that role is though, it is not the most important one in the faith formation of their young learners. That role is reserved for their parents, and our role, is to *support the parents* to the best of our ability.

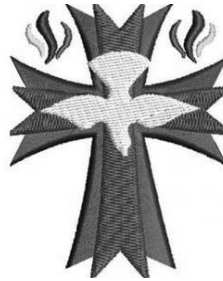

We assist parents in their children's Faith Formation by making more explicit the teachings of the Catholic Church and helping the children celebrate their faith and apply its teachings to their lives.

Attention 2017 - Confirmation Students (Confirmandi)

It is not too early to start thinking of your Confirmation Sponsor!!



Every year we witness heartbreak because the sponsor the Confirmandi chose is not able to obtain a Sponsor Certificate from their Parish. Prepare ahead and make sure a sponsor candidate is qualified!

Parents help your children understand the reasons why we (the Catholic Church) require the following:

SPONSOR QUALIFICATIONS:

To be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, you must:

1. Not be the parent of the child/candidate
2. Must be at least 16 years of age
3. A Roman Catholic who has received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation.
4. A registered member of a parish.
5. A practicing Catholic, who participates at Mass, receives Reconciliation regularly and believes and lives according to the teachings of the Church.
6. (If married) Must be married according to the laws of the Catholic Church and living in a valid marriage. Persons who are divorced but not remarried outside the Church and not living with someone outside of marriage, are eligible.



******Requests for Sponsor Certificates will be honored after the individual making the request has been a registered member of the parish for a period of three (3) months or more. Thank you!**
