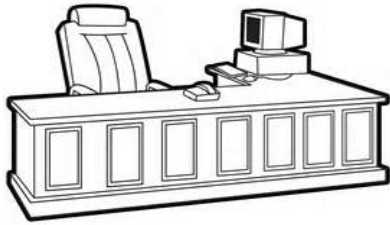

From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk "Tough Decision"

The last few days have been a bit rough as I have been receiving criticism, but that happens when you are the pastor. As I am sure that many of you have heard, the decision was made to suspend our CYO basketball program. It was not an easy decision to make. I prayed about it a lot, and talked with the deacons, the Finance Committee, and the Pastoral Council about it. While I have their support, in the end the decision was mine.

When I first arrived at Resurrection Parish, I asked about the Sports Program, and learned that it was a very extensive basketball program with several teams for boys and girls for different age groups. I was also told that there were problems with the program, mostly a lack of accountability to the parish. The maintenance staff frequently reported that there was a lot of mess from the program, and not the typical mess from use. Papers were thrown over the bathroom floor, the bathrooms were often flooded, there were puddles of spit on the gym floor, and kids were too often unsupervised in the halls. My biggest concern was the report that it was often difficult getting a list of the new coaches to make sure that they had gone through the VIRTUS training and fingerprinting. There were times when people were allowed to coach before they had completed those requirements for Child Protection, even though the program was explicitly told that it was not permitted, as it was the policy of both the parish and the Diocese. Fortunately, none of those persons' background checks came back with any reason to give us concern, but nevertheless they should not have been coaching until the background check had been completed.

Despite these concerns, these were things which we could work on correcting. The main reason for the decision for suspending the program was financial. Despite what many parishioners believe, the parish is NOT debt free. While we do not have any mortgages, we have been falling behind in paying our bills, especially to the Diocese. This year we were looking at a \$250,000 budget deficit. I have let go the two part-time cooks who were here when I arrived - I am happy to do my own cooking. I have reduced other household expenses by over 30% (reduced the number of cable boxes, minimized the cable package, continually trying to make the rectory more efficient in terms of electricity and AC/heating). The staff will not be getting a raise this year. Despite these efforts, the fact remains that for the last several years our weekly collection has continued to decline, while our expenses increase.

The Sports Program was costing the parish about \$35,000 a year between the utilities (the program was using the gym 6-7 days a week for 4-5 hours for over 6 months), maintenance, and the salary of the part-time janitor we hired to be there in the evenings. We have let the janitor go, and hope to see nearly \$10,000 savings from utilities.

Despite the gossip, the parish is not "all about money." However, we do have a moral obligation to pay our bills. Like any family, when money is tight, we have to examine our priorities and cut back on things that are less essential. The mission of the parish is to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ, and to administer the sacraments. While I would love to continue the CYO basketball program, we simply cannot afford it at this time. While it did draw many young families to our parish center, too many of those same families did not participate in the overall life of the parish. They do not come to church on Sundays or volunteer for other activities of the parish. The surrounding municipalities have extensive sports programs for children to participate in.

When we finalize the budget in the next few weeks, I will have more to say about our financial situation. Again, I am sorry that we had to suspend the sports program, and hopefully we will be able to restore it in the future when our finances allow it.

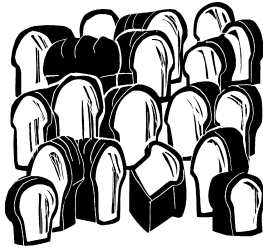

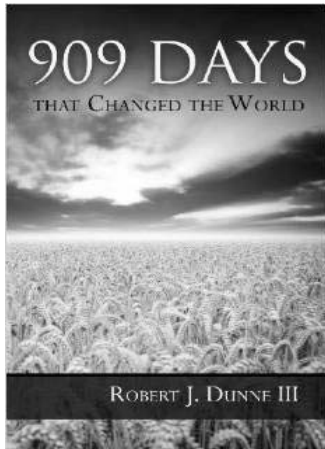

Author Robert J. Dunne III will discuss his book, "909 Days That Changed the World"

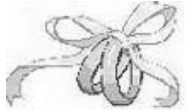

Attention 2017 - Confirmation Students

It is not too early to start thinking of your Confirmation Sponsor!! Every year we witness heartbreak because the sponsor the Confirmandi chose is not able to obtain a Sponsor Certificate from their Parish. Prepare ahead and make sure a sponsor candidate is qualified! Parents help your children understand the reasons why we (the Catholic Church) require the following:

SPONSOR QUALIFICATIONS:

To be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, you must:

1. Not be the parent of the child/candidate
2. Must be at least 16 years of age
3. A Roman Catholic who has received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation.
4. A registered member of a parish.
5. A practicing Catholic, who participates at Mass, receives Reconciliation regularly and believes and lives according to the teachings of the Church.
6. (If married) Must be married according to the laws of the Catholic Church and living in a valid marriage. Persons who are divorced but not remarried outside the Church and not living with someone outside of marriage, are eligible.

****Requests for Sponsor Certificates will be honored after the individual making the request has been a registered member of the parish for a period of three (3) months or more. Thank you!
