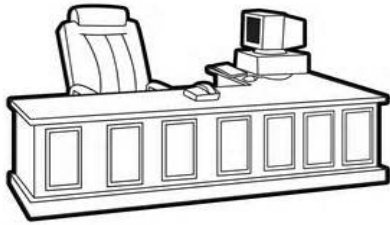

## From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk "Jesus in Near Us"

Starting in September, on the First Friday of each month, we will be having an Eucharistic Holy Hour. It will begin at 5 PM, and will be at St. Casimir Church. As I mentioned in my homily for Corpus Christi, back in June, there has been a growing lack of belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist among Catholics in the United States. This is a real tragedy, since the Eucharist is the source and summit of the Catholic life. Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction used to be more widely practiced than it is today; I remember when I was a child, my parish had Adoration every Monday. It is a practice that needs to be revived, so we are going to start with First Fridays. (Of course, we are blessed to have a perpetual Adoration Chapel at Holy Name Church, which I strongly encourage parishioners to visit).

A natural question is, "What is Eucharistic Adoration, and why should we do it?" I have always loved St. John Vianney's response to someone who asked him what did he do when he prayed before the Eucharist. He said, "I look at Him, and He looks at me." Eucharistic Adoration is honoring the presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. It involves contemplating the Mystery of Christ truly present before us. During Adoration we watch and wait, trying to remain silent before the Lord of Lord, and open our hearts as much as possible to the graces which flow from the Eucharist, so that we can be transformed into the person that God wants us to be.

During Mass, the gifts of bread and wine, which we bring to the altar, are transformed (the theological term is "transubstantiated") into the actual Body and Blood of Christ Jesus at the moment of Consecration. This means that the bread and wine are not only spiritually or symbolically transformed, but rather they are actually (substantially) transformed into the Body and Blood of Jesus. The elements retain the appearance and taste (the "accidents") of bread and wine, but are indeed the actual Body and Blood of Christ. This is what is meant by "Real Presence": the actual, physical presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Jesus instituted this sacrament so that He could remain near us until the end of time.

The Blessed Sacrament becomes a focal point of devotion even outside of Mass. It is reserved in the tabernacle, not only so it can be taken to the sick, but so He can be worshiped and adored at all times. St. John Paul II said in one of his homilies, "It is pleasant to spend time with Him, to lie close to His breast like the Beloved Disciple (cf. John 13:25) and to feel the infinite love present in His heart . . . If, in our time Christians must be distinguished by the 'art of prayer,' how can we not feel a renewed need to spend time in spiritual conversation, in silent adoration, in heartfelt love before Christ present in the Most Holy Sacrament?"

Through Eucharistic Adoration we proclaim Jesus to the World. It is an affirmation of our faith. Through this devotion, we give witness to our belief that God is truly dwelling with His people.

The Eucharist is the Sacrament of unity. Through the personal love, that we share with Jesus, we are more able to grasp the reality that we are the whole Body of Christ. Praying as a community help to build a "civilization of love."

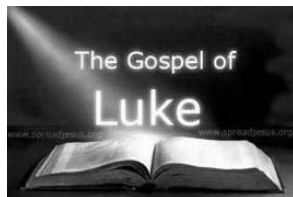
## Reflect on the Word of Jesus Christ

Aug 21, 2016

### 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

*Getting to the Kingdom is not easy!*

Jesus wanted people to understand that entering the Kingdom of Heaven wasn't going to be easy. He asked everyone to strive to enter through the "narrow gate". Which means that not everyone was going to be



able to pass through.

The idea of a narrow gate would have been understood by the people whom Jesus was teaching. In many parts of the ancient world, huge stone walls were built around large cities for protection. Narrow gates in the walls allowed people to walk through, but horses, donkeys and camels with their carts of "stuff" could not get through.



One thing we can learn from this story is that God doesn't want us to wait until later to enter through the narrow gate. The "master of the house (God)" may lock the door at any moment. *So we can begin now to be able to get through the gate,* Jesus also

tells us that the order of things will be reversed: those who are last would be first and those who are first would be last, Be humble, be kind, take care of others!!

Adult: Wow, time to get ready! Sunday Mass, Reconciliation, prayer and taking care of others must be first on my list. Time to start getting ready!

Child: Jesus, you really **do not ask that much of us do you?** I will try very hard to keep myself ready!!!

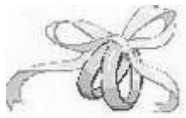
**Author Robert J. Dunne III will discuss his book, "909 Days That Changed the World"**

### Attention 2017 - Confirmation Students

**Important!!! - Do it now!!!!**



It is not too early to start thinking of your Confirmation Sponsor!! Every year we witness heartbreak because the sponsor the Confirmandi chose is not able to obtain a Sponsor Certificate from their Parish. Prepare ahead and make sure a sponsor candidate is qualified! Parents help your children understand the reasons why we (the Catholic Church) require the following:

#### SPONSOR QUALIFICATIONS:

To be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, you must:

1. Not be the parent of the child/candidate
2. Must be at least 16 years of age
3. A Roman Catholic who has received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation.
4. A registered member of a parish.
5. A practicing Catholic, who participates at Mass, receives Reconciliation regularly and believes and lives according to the teachings of the Church.
6. (If married) Must be married according to the laws of the Catholic Church and living in a valid marriage. Persons who are divorced but not remarried outside the Church and not living with someone outside of marriage, are eligible.

\*\*\*\*Requests for Sponsor Certificates will be honored after the individual making the request has been a registered member of the parish for a period of three (3) months or more. Thank you!
