

From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk "What to Expect During Eucharistic Exposition"

This coming Friday, the First Friday of September, we will begin our monthly Eucharistic Holy Hour. Last week, I wrote about the general reasons and benefits of spending an hour with our Eucharistic Lord. This week I would like to say a little about what to expect during our Holy Hour.

There are several different ways in which Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction can be done. I have decided that we will be having our Holy Hour at 5 PM (in St. Casimir's), that we will have our Exposition during the celebration of Evening Prayer (Vespers). Evening Prayer is part of the Liturgy of the Hours by which we sanctify the entire day. The Liturgy of the Hours is made up of Morning Prayer (Lauds), Daytime Prayer, Evening Prayer (Vespers), Night Prayer (Compline) and the Office of Readings (Matins). All priests and religious are required to pray the Liturgy of the Hours in their entirety, while permanent deacons are required to say at least to the two "hinged" hours: Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer. However, all the faithful are encouraged to pray the Liturgy of the Hours, at least in part, as a means of glorifying God throughout the day.

After the people have gathered, the minister enters in silence, bows to the altar, and then places the Blessed Sacrament in the monstrance. The minister will then kneel before the monstrance and incense the holy Eucharist. The minister then goes to the presider's chair and begins by saying, "God, come to my assistance," and all reply, "Lord, make hast to help me. Glory be to the Father," Then an appropriate song is sung.

This is followed by the Psalmody; the reciting of three psalms. Traditionally, the psalms are recited in "choir-style," that is the two sides of the church alternating in saying the verses of the psalm and all repeating the antiphon at the end (for our purposes, the side by the statue of the Blessed Mother will be side 1, and the side by the tabernacle will be side 2).

After the Psalmody, the minister will read the Gospel of the day, and then give a brief homily. This will be followed by a long period of silence. This is when we adore the Lord, present to us in the Eucharist exposed in the monstrance. We bring to Jesus our hearts, with all their hurts, needs, and praise and thanksgiving. We also need to quiet ourselves and give Jesus a chance to speak to our hearts. Remember what St. John Vianney said about what he did during adoration, "I look at Him, and He looks at me."

At the end of this time of silent adoration, all will participate in the Responsory and recite/sing the Canticle of Mary. Then there are intercessions, and the Evening Prayer part ends with all saying the Our Father.

The final part of our Holy Hour is Benediction. The minister again kneels before the monstrance, and incenses the Blessed Sacrament. During this time another appropriate song is sung. The minister then says a prayer, and puts on the humeral veil, takes the monstrance and makes the sign of the cross over the people in silence. As the minister reposes the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle, the Divine Praises (or another appropriate song) is sung/recited, and the minister departs.

That's it. It might seem like a lot of new things, and if you are not used to praying the Liturgy of the Hours, then it will be new. However, it will be a holy time, and you will soon get used to the format of the Liturgy of the Hours. I also plan to have a worship aide printed, so it should be easy to follow along.

Again, we begin our First Fridays Eucharist Holy Hour this coming Friday, September 2 at 5 PM at St. Casimir.




Indoor Walking at Resurrection Parish
