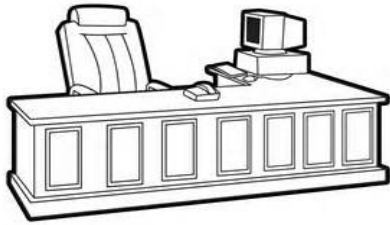

## From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk "Warrior's Ethos"

Last week, I began to talk about the long tradition in our Catholic Faith to view our life as a disciple of Christ in terms of spiritual combat. In order to be Strong in Faith – Fortes in Fide – we must go "all in" for Christ. A former Navy SEAL described being a warrior in this way, "One of the things that makes a warrior into a warrior is that they are dedicated to developing their strength in service to others." As disciples of Jesus Christ, we are also called to develop and use the gifts and talents which God has given us to "build up the Kingdom of God" by serving those around us.

This dedication to Christ and to others is revealed in the Warrior Ethos:

- I will always place the mission first.
- I will never accept defeat.
- I will never quit.
- I will never leave a fallen comrade.

Reflection on this Warrior Ethos for a few minutes. Think of it in terms of our being a Christian. What is our mission? Well our specific role we need to discern through prayer, but the general mission of all Christians is to go and make disciples of all the nations. In other words, we are all called to be witnesses of the Gospel to everyone we encounter in life. This means putting Christ first in our lives, so that in everything we do and in everything we say it is for Christ and for building up His Kingdom. Yes, I did say everything – even the littlest thing we do should be done in, with, and for Jesus Christ.

"I will never accept defeat." The world thought it had defeated Jesus by nailing Him on the Cross. However, three days later Jesus rose victoriously. He conquered sin and death. Christ Victor! As a Christian, we believe that Jesus is victorious, so no matter what we encounter in life, we should never accept it as a defeat. A set-back, maybe. A challenge to change our ways, a possibility. A defeat – NEVER. As long as we follow Christ Jesus, as long as we stay united with Him, we can never be defeated; we will share in His Victory.

"I will never quit." This is closely related to never accepting defeat. During His public life, Jesus must have shaken His head a lot. No matter what He said and did, the disciples so often just did not get it. But Jesus did not throw up His hands and say, "It's no use, I'm going back to being a carpenter." No, Jesus kept proclaiming the Good News that His Father sent Him to proclaim. He kept doing the work that His Father gave Him to do. Even when He was carrying His cross, He fell three times. Yet He never quit. Each time, He got back up and continued on. As soldiers in Christ's army we can never quit. We will experience failures, times when it seems like the good work we are doing just is not making a difference, times when we will sin. But we cannot quit. St. Paul experienced this himself. He once wrote, "Why do I fail to do the good things I want to do, but do the evil things I do not want to do?" Yet he never gave up, he never quit. We must dedicate ourselves to never quitting. When we fall, we must get back up.

"I will never leave a fallen comrade." In Christ, through our baptism, we are all members of the Mystical Body of Christ. We are all comrades. Our spirituality can never be just "me and Jesus." It must always be "we and Jesus." We need to support each other as we follow Jesus. We need to pray for each other, we need to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, instruct the ignorant, visit the sick – all those corporal and spiritual acts of Mercy. True charity is helping our comrade achieve their ultimate destiny, and that ultimate destiny for each of us is Heaven.

We are called to be Warriors for Christ Jesus. We must dedicate ourselves to His mission, we must never accept defeat because Jesus has been victorious, we must never quit for Jesus is our constant companion, and we just never leave a fallen comrade behind. We are our brother's, and sister's, keeper. Onward Christian Soldiers – Heaven awaits us.

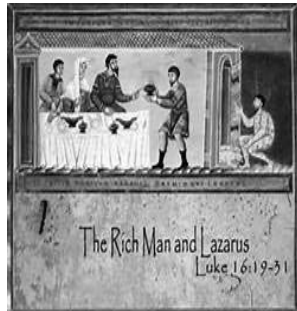
## Reflect on the Word of Jesus Christ

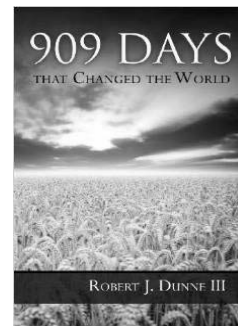
Jesus asks us to serve and share the riches we have been given. Those in need might not just be hungry, they may need a job or a warm place to sleep. They

## NJ bishops oppose 'deceptive' ad campaign

The Catholic bishops of New Jersey are responding vociferously and unanimously in opposition to a pro-abortion ad campaign recently conducted by a group calling itself Catholics for Choice.

The abortion advocacy organization placed full-page ads Sept. 12 in the print editions of more than 20 local and national publications, including Politico, the Nation, the Chicago Sun-Times, the Philadelphia Inquirer, the Dallas Morning News and La Opinion.

In New Jersey, the ad ran in The Star-Ledger and The Record (of Bergen County). Digital advertising was also included in the campaign, which featured a statement by a young woman who claimed to be Catholic and who condoned abortion. The ad aimed to portray the public funding of abortion as a social justice value.

In an effort to communicate true Church teaching on the sanctity of human life and the abomination of abortion, the New Jersey bishops commissioned a campaign that will include advertising in several daily newspapers and across diocesan media outlets and other Church-based resources.

The central image of the campaign features a photo of Pope Francis kissing a baby during his visit to Philadelphia last fall. Taken by John Blaine, a freelance photographer for The Monitor, the photo originally was part of the Trenton diocesan newspaper's online coverage of the papal visit. The ad lists several statements made by the Holy Father -- both when he was Cardinal Jose Mario Bergoglio of Buenos Aires and as Pope Francis -- about the sanctity of human life and every person's call to protect life in the womb.

The key message of the ad is: "You can not be Catholic and Pro-Abortion. The only 'choice' for Catholics is life." The ads are set to run in The Star-Ledger and The Record Sept. 18.

Similar responses were playing out across the country in the days following Sept. 12. In a Sept. 14 statement, New York Cardinal Timothy M. Dolan, who serves as chairman of the U.S. bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities, stated, "Calling for taxpayer funding of abortion in the name of the Catholic faith" is "deceptive" and "extreme."

He emphasized that the abortion advocacy group "is not affiliated with the Catholic Church in any way. It has no membership, and clearly does not speak for the faithful. It is funded by powerful private foundations to promote abortion as a method of population control."

Multiple dioceses have used this opportunity to encourage Catholics and all people of good will to have an impact on social justice by supporting local pregnancy help centers. 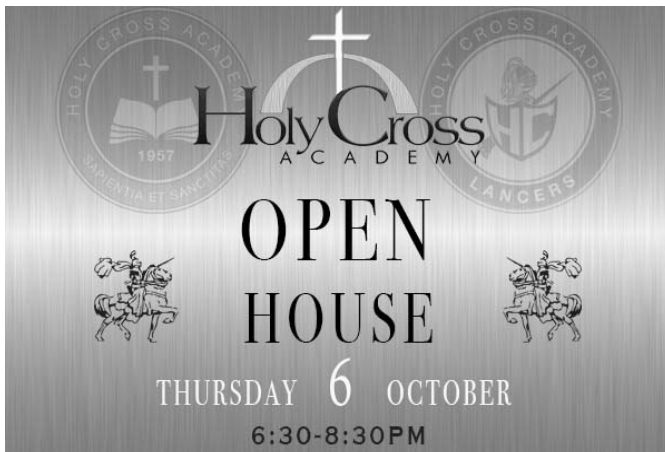

Every year we witness heartbreak because the sponsor the Confirmandi chose is not able to obtain a Sponsor Certificate from their Parish. Prepare ahead and make sure a sponsor candidate is qualified!



Parents help your children understand the reasons why we require the following:

### SPONSOR QUALIFICATIONS:

To be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, you must:

1. Not be the parent of the child/candidate
2. Must be at least 16 years of age
3. A Roman Catholic who has received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation.
4. A registered member of a parish.
5. A practicing Catholic, who participates at Mass, receives Reconciliation regularly and believes and lives according to the teachings of the Church.
6. (If married) Must be married according to the laws of the Catholic Church and living in a valid marriage. Persons who are divorced but not remarried outside the Church and not living with someone outside of marriage, are eligible.



\*\*\*\*Requests for Sponsor Certificates will be honored after the individual making the request has been a registered member of the parish for a period of three (3) months or more.
