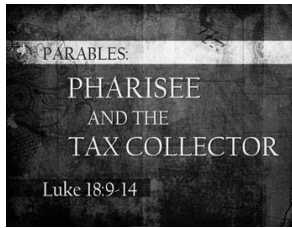

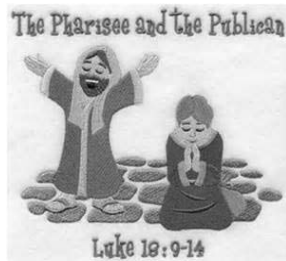
God Hears and responds!

The Pharisee would be considered a defender of the law the tax collector is agitated because this law cheats people. **Jesus makes a point that the tax collector is justified, not the Pharisee, because the tax collector is justified, not the Pharisee. Contact Your Assemblyman and State Senator Regarding Assisted Suicide Bill.

On Oct. 6, 2016, the Assembly Appropriations Committee released Assembly Bill 2451 which would make assisted suicide legal in New Jersey. A2451 could be voted on in the General Assembly in the near future. An identical bill (S2474) has been introduced in the Senate.

This assisted suicide bill is a direct threat to anyone viewed as a cost liability to an insurance company. In an era of cost control and managed care, patients with lingering illnesses may be branded as an economic liability, and decisions to encourage death could be driven by cost.

The facts are clear; in California, in Vermont and in Oregon – states that have passed assisted suicide bills – insurance companies have denied individuals healthcare coverage, but offered them low-cost drugs to end their lives.

Start thinking of your Confirmation Sponsor!!



Every year we witness heartbreak because the sponsor the Confirmandi chose is not able to obtain a

Sponsor Certificate from their Parish.

Prepare ahead and make sure a sponsor candidate is qualified! Parents help your children understand the reasons why we require the following:

SPONSOR QUALIFICATIONS:

To be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, you must: **Be a practicing Catholic!!!!!!!**

1. Not be the parent of the child/candidate
2. Must be at least 16 years of age
3. A Roman Catholic who has received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation.
4. A registered member of a parish.
5. A practicing Catholic, who participates at Mass, receives Reconciliation regularly and believes and lives according to the teachings of the Church.
6. (If married) Must be married according to the laws of the Catholic Church and living in a valid marriage. Persons who are divorced but not remarried outside the Church and not living with someone outside of marriage, are eligible.

****Requests for Sponsor Certificates will be honored after the individual making the request has been a registered member of the parish for a period of three (3) months or more. Thank you!
