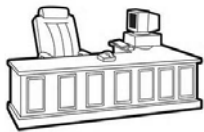

From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk "Let's Talk Finances"

In this bulletin you will find the parish's financial report and the budget for this fiscal year. It is a tad late; while the fiscal year begins July 1, the budget does not have to be into the Diocese until September 1, and we try to get it into the bulletin in October. I would normally be happy to just let our business manager, Trish Haran, publish the report, but I think I need to make some comments about the financial state of the parish. I would describe it as "not being terrible, but not good either." First, let me address a commonly held false belief that the parish has no debt. THIS IS NOT TRUE! And it has not been true for many years.

It is true that we have no long-term debts, such as a mortgage. When the former St. Casimir Convent was sold in March, 2015, the proceeds did pay off the mortgage of the Parish Center, but by the end of that fiscal year the parish still owed the Diocese \$17,000 in assessments. The sale of the convent, and the inflow of funds from the capital campaign in a way masked the financial situation of the parish, so let me try to explain. While we are much better off than some of the surrounding parishes in terms of what we owe to the Diocese, we currently owe the Diocese \$71,000 for last year's assessment, which is debt (since it is past due).

There are three main bills that we owe the Diocese each year; the assessment (10% of our regular income) which is around \$71,000 each year, the property liability insurance which will be around \$69,000, and the educational co-sponsorship which is around \$37,000. That is approximately \$180,000 that we owe the Diocese each year. Then we have our operating expenses. Allow me to point out some troubling trends.

Looking from July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2016 our First Collection (including electronic giving) has declined about 16%. This is our primary source of revenue. Our Holy Day Collections (primarily Christmas and Easter) has also declined about 16% during that time frame. Our other major, stable source of revenue comes from rentals/leases, which has declined about 40% due to no longer renting the convent, and the friars reduced the rent that Refreshing Life Praise Cathedral pays for the use of the former St. Casimir gym (Refreshing Life hopes to buy the building in the future). That means that since July 1, 2012 the parish's income has declined approximately 20%.

On the expense side, for the same time period, clergy salary has increased 17%. This is due mostly to needing to pay for extra clergy. Each time we have a priest come to say a Mass on the weekend we have to pay them \$100/Mass plus a \$25 travel fee (one per day). That is why I try to do most of the Masses myself; I get \$10/day (not per Mass) for celebrating Mass. The salaries of the staff, including the music ministry, has increase 27%, the cost of benefits (medical, pension, etc) has risen 33%. Thanks to the solar field and mine shutting down heating and AC in much of the rectory, we have been able to reduce our utilities by 8%. The Rectory/Household expenses have decreased 19%, but in just the year I have been here they have been reduced by 56%.

In sum, our expenses continue to increase while our income decreases. The parish staff agreed to no raises this year, and I eliminated three part-time positions. I do not see how we can reduce the staff any further. If trends continue, we will have to look at closing other programs just because we cannot afford them. I do not want to do this.

This is why evangelization is so important. We need to get more people into the parish. We need more volunteers to do that and the other programs. The number one expressed need from our parish survey was youth ministry, yet no one has come forward to take leadership of the American Heritage Girls troop, both the Boy Scout Troop and Cub Scout Troop need more adult volunteers, and when Dennis Taylor tried to start a Y-Disciple youth ministry program, NO ONE came forward.

All of us need to prayerful discern our priorities in terms of time, talent and treasure. As Bishop O'Connell recently told a group of us, "Preaching the Gospel is free. Everything else costs," and not only in terms of money but also in terms of time and talent.

I need your help to keep this parish vibrant.

To All of the Good People of Resurrection,

Over the past few weeks, I have shared how the Faith to Move Mountains Campaign will strengthen our Diocesan schools and parishes, support our clergy and seminarians, care for our retired priests, enhance our religious education and evangelization programs, and expand our social service outreach. In addition to these projects, Resurrection has been invited to raise a minimum of \$695,000, of which we will receive 30% (\$208,500) to address our own local needs listed below:

* **Evangelization**

This is one of the greatest needs of the Church throughout the United States. We have seen the participation in Sunday Mass fall from over 75% in the 1960s to less than 20% today. There are a number of programs that offer training for how to re-evangelize a parish, so some of the funds that we receive from the "Faith to Move Mountains" campaign will be used to send members of Resurrection Parish to training in evangelization, and get the materials they will need to effectively evangelize.

* **Youth Ministry**

Resurrection Parish has not had a youth ministry program in years. While we have had a volunteer this past year who has tried to get a program started, no real headway has been made. Looking at successful youth ministry programs in the Diocese the first thing you notice is that they all have a paid youth minister. Some of the money raised will be used as seed money to hire a youth minister and ensure they have the resources to reach out to the youth in our parish.

* **Debt Relief**

Currently the parish does not have any mortgages or other long term debts, however, for the last three years we have not been able to pay all our bills to the Diocese. While the Diocese is very patient, we need to be better able to pay our bills. A portion of the money collected will be used to help address this issue.
