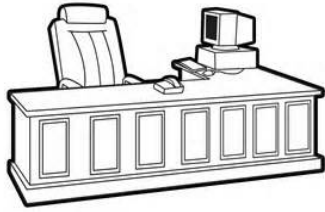

From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk "Advent: He Comes!"

We all know what time of year it is. I am sure that many of you have already broken out the Christmas decorations. The lights are going up on the house, and the tree will soon be decorated. The stores will start staying open longer as we all head out to do our Christmas shopping; unless you are like me and already have your shopping finished. Presents will need to be wrapped, cards will need to be mailed out, and there seems to be a steady stream of Christmas and Holiday parties to attend. This is one of the busiest times of the year.

Are we just too busy with our lives to include Christ in our Christmas? What about in our lives in general?

The Church's liturgical year begins with the season of Advent. It is a time when the Church asks us to stop what we are doing and reassess where we are spiritually. Is Christ the most important thing in our lives, or do we tend to just "fit Him in" when our lives are not too busy. What is more important for us; sports or Jesus? Have we fallen away from Jesus through sloth, pride, greed, or some other sin? While we are keeping busy preparing to celebrate Christmas, the memory of Jesus' first coming, are we also preparing ourselves for Christ's Second Coming?

Through the Advent Liturgy, the Church invites us to examine the path we are on, to perhaps redirect our focus: if our lives are not Christ centered, now is the time to get back on track. The readings of the Sundays of Advent focus on two events: the anniversary of Jesus' First Coming, Christmas, and His Second Coming, Judgment Day. In fact, the word "advent" comes from the Latin word, "adventus," which is the translation of the Greek word "parousia," which is the word used to refer to Christ's Second Coming in the New Testament. The link between the two Comings of Jesus is simple; because God so loved the world that He sent His only-begotten son to be born of the Virgin at Christmas, we can trust in the mercy of Christ Jesus at His Second Coming. This gives us hope that we will have eternal life with our Savior in heaven.

On this, the First Sunday of Advent, the main message from our readings is to "Wake up! Stay awake! Get ready!" It is very easy to get lost in the busyness of our lives, even in the routine. We can get lost in the "here-and-now" and lose sight of the future, which the prophets of the Old Testament referred to as "The Day of the Lord." Judgment Day is coming, whether we like it or not. The end of time might not happen in our life time, but our time will end in death. Are we ready for Judgment Day? If we forget about Jesus in our daily affairs, we will be left out of the wedding banquet when He comes again. We need to be intentional in our relationship with Jesus. So, WAKE UP! GET READY! Jesus is coming.

First Friday's Holy Hour

We have a Holy Hour at 5 PM (in St. Casimir's - 502 New Jersey Ave., Riverside) on the First Friday each month, which includes Exposition during the celebration of Evening Prayer (Vespers) and Benediction. Evening Prayer is part of the Liturgy of the Hours by which we sanctify the entire day. The Liturgy of the Hours is made up of Morning Prayer (Lauds), Daytime Prayer, Evening Prayer (Vespers), Night Prayer (Compline) and the Office of Readings (Matins). Everyone is invited to attend on December 2nd.

Reflect on the Word of Jesus Christ

November 27, 2016
First Sunday of Advent



The season of Advent, the start of the liturgical year, is not a time for passively waiting. We are to stay alert and awake waiting for the Lord to break into our lives at any moment! *This week is a wonderful opportunity to get a*

jump start in sharing the Light of Christ with the world. With a new liturgical year we experience a change in season as well as a new liturgical color (purple).

WAKE UP and WALK in the LIGHT! Our readings today remind us that we need to always be prepared and ready. We need to wake up and get out of bed the first time we hear the alarm and do not hit the snooze button! *Our readings for Advent are like that alarm; they are teaching us that we have to be alert and anxious because Jesus will step into our lives at any moment!*

Let's think about something else that helps keep us awake. At night, when we are ready to go to sleep, what is one of the last things you do before getting into bed? Turn off the lights in the room, it is much easier to fall asleep when it is dark.

One way to stay awake and be ready for the Son of God to come is to **walk in the light of the Lord**. If we consciously think about walking in the light (*making good choices*), not putting other people down, not making fun of others, who are different, being kind to the elderly and to those who are not as fortunate as we are) we are walking in God's light. We are living the way Jesus taught us to live. So when he returns we are ready.



Adult: Lord Jesus, help me to make choices to walk in the light in every liturgical season! Help me Jesus to stay awake daily that I make choices to stay in your light!

Child: Jesus, help me make choices to walk in your light. I want to be ready for you. I know my choices are Mass, Eucharist, Reconciliation and serving others!

An important notice to all birth parents who placed babies for adoption

New Jersey Adoption Law has changed. Beginning Jan. 1, 2017, adoptees and certain relatives will be able to obtain a copy of an original birth certificate without a court order. Birth parents who wish to preserve their privacy must submit a Redaction Request Form to the New Jersey Department of Health no later than Dec. 31, 2016. The form can be obtained by calling 866-649-8726, ext. 582 or downloading it at <http://nj.gov/health/forms/reg-36c.pdf>. ARE YOU HAVING A WEDDING ANNIVERSARY?

For the coming liturgical year, the Diocese of Trenton is focusing on “Building Strong Marriages.” Throughout the year, you will probably be hearing more homilies on marriage and family life. There will also be other programs to celebrate and strengthen marriages throughout the year. This is most fitting since marriage is one of the sacraments for the “service of the Church” as the Catechism teaches (the other is Holy Orders).

Here at Resurrection Parish we are also going to promote “Building Strong Marriages,” by offering a special anniversary blessing for couples celebrating their wedding anniversary each month. We are going to ask couples who are celebrating an anniversary to let the parish office know by the last Monday of the month prior to their anniversary; for example, if your anniversary is in December, you would let the office know by the last Monday in November (however, since we are getting a late jump on this, just for December anniversaries, you have until the first Monday of December to let the office know). Let us know your name, your anniversary date (it is up to you if you want to include the year), and which Mass you generally attend. The second weekend of the month will be the weekend in which we celebrate all the anniversaries for that month. We will have all the month’s anniversaries listed in the bulletin, and at each Mass that weekend we will have a pew reserved for the couples. After the homily, the couples will be invited to stand for a renewal of their commitment to each other which is in the new “Order of Celebrating Matrimony” that the Church just published. We will have a card for the couple with the “Renewal of Commitment” prayer that the couple will say. Then, after the Our Father, the priest will give the couple a special blessing.

The public witness of the couple’s faithful, permanent, and fruitful love for each other is a tremendous service to the whole Church as it testifies to Christ’s own love for the Church. We are all looking forward to celebrating matrimony each month.

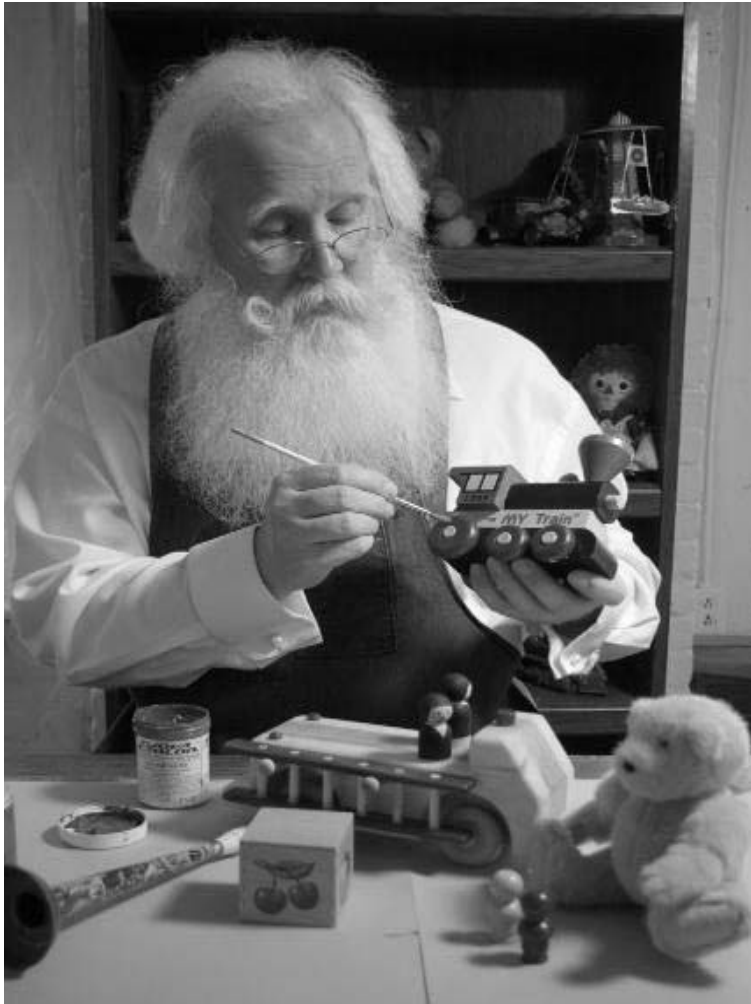
