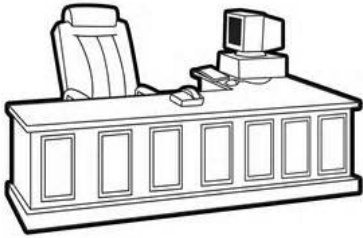

## From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk "Rejoice in the Lord Always!"

The third Sunday of Advent is known as "Gaudete Sunday." Gaudete is the Latin word for "joy." Actually, it is a command, "Rejoice," and it comes from the traditional entrance antiphon for the third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete in Domino Semper, "Rejoice in the Lord Always!"

As Christmas nears, the penitential mood of Advent starts to give way to one of joy and expectation. To highlight this joyful mood, the priest can wear rose colored vestments instead of purple. The rose color represents the color of the sky just before the sun rises.

The readings this week focus on the "Day of the Lord." We are told that the "Day of the Lord" is imminent, and in fact has already been established. While some of the language from the Old Testament reading may make the "Day of the Lord" seem to be something to be feared, for Christians, the "Day of the Lord" is Good News. It is a time of the New Creation, and a restoration of all things in Christ Jesus.

This "Day of the Lord," Jesus refers to as the Kingdom of God. Some might think of the Kingdom of God as something we hope for in the future, but our Christian Faith teaches us that the Kingdom of God is already and not yet. Through His incarnation, Jesus has already established the Kingdom of God. As He points out to the disciples of John the Baptist who come to speak with Him, the work that He does, as Isaiah predicted - "the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them" - points to the new reality of the Kingdom of God already among us.

The Kingdom of God is not yet complete. It will reach perfection at the end of time, when all things are restored in Christ.

That means that we have work to do. As disciples of Jesus, we are tasked with building up the Kingdom of God, everyday in our own lives. By opening ourselves up to the Gospel, our blindness and deafness will be cured. Instead of being crippled by sin, we will be able to walk in the light of Christ. Having been made a new Creation by Christ Jesus, we are to preach the good news by how we live our lives, and by the words we speak.

So, while we are called - commanded actually - to rejoice in the Lord and His mighty works in our lives, we are also reminded that we must be patient as we await the completion of the Kingdom of God when Christ Jesus comes again. St. James, in his letter which we heard from today, encourages Christians not to waver in their faith, and he tells us how we should behave as we wait for the Lord. He tells us that Christians should live together in peace and not complain against one another. How much complaining and grumbling do we do in our lives? Complaining and grumbling are signs of spiritual immaturity, and is a waste of time.

Rather we should "Rejoice in the Lord Always! Again I say Rejoice!"

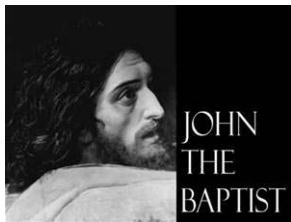

3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent: *"Be patient, brothers and sisters, until the coming of the Lord" (James 5:7).*

**The season of Advent challenges us to wait patiently for the coming of Christ. What can you do within your family to focus your hearts on Christ this Advent?**

Here at Resurrection Parish we are also promoting "Building Strong Marriages," by offering a special anniversary blessing for couples celebrating their wedding anniversary each month. We ask couples who are celebrating an anniversary to let the parish office know by the last Monday of the month prior to their anniversary; for example, if your anniversary is in December, you would let the office know by the last Monday in November (however, since we are getting a late jump on this, just for December anniversaries, you have until the first Monday of December to let the office know). Let us know your name, your anniversary date (it is up to you if you want to include the year), and which Mass you generally attend. The second weekend of the month will be the weekend in which we celebrate all the anniversaries for that month. We will have all the month's anniversaries listed in the bulletin, and at each Mass that weekend we will have a pew reserved for the couples. After the homily, the couples will be invited to stand for a renewal of their commitment to each other which is in the new "Order of Celebrating Matrimony" that the Church just published. We will have a card for the couple with the "Renewal of Commitment" prayer that the couple will say. Then, after the Our Father, the priest will give the couple a special blessing.

The public witness of the couple's faithful, permanent, and fruitful love for each other is a tremendous service to the whole Church as it testifies to Christ's own love for the Church. We are all looking forward to celebrating matrimony each month.

## Resurrection Parish Faith Formation Program December 11, 2016 - Third Sunday of Advent

### Confirmation Sponsor

Preparing for the Liturgical Rite of Confirmation the Anointing with Chrism. The Confirmation Sponsor plays a visible role at this point in the liturgy. This is

when the Sacrament is conferred. The sponsor will accompany the candidate when he or she is called to stand before the Bishop/Priest you will place your hand on your candidate's shoulder and **clearly say** his or her Confirmation name to the Bishop/Priest

The celebrant will dip his thumb in holy oil, called Chrism and make the Sign of the Cross on the candidates

(Confirmation forehead, The Bishop had previously consecrated this oil at what is known as the Chrism Mass, during Holy Week. It is the same oil that is used in the Sacrament of Baptism and Holy Orders (when a man becomes a priest). As the Bishop makes the Sign of the Cross on the candidate's forehead, he will say , (Name) be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit."

and the candidate will say "Amen". You can pray your own private prayer You the Sponsor can say your own private "Amen" expressing **your commitment to supporting the candidate**



*Our Faith is more than a subject to be taught it is an invitation to a way of life.*

**Strive to use questions that are open ended. For example instead of asking, "Do you remember your first communion?" Ask , "What is your favorite story about your first communion."** A difficult question can put the heat of the spotlight right on you. Learn to deflect such questions by shifting the attention off of yourself and onto the question. **Respond to a difficult question by tossing it back at the questioner "What do you think? Or by inviting anyone else in the group to share their thoughts while you compose yourself and collect your own thoughts. If you do not know the answer, let them know you will get back to them with the correct answer. Jesus was very good at responding to a question with a question!!**

Jesus did not jump in with the correct answer but waited for the disciples to offer the best replies they could. As catechists, we need to resist the temptation to always give the answers immediately.

**We need to guide our children into discussion so they can understand in their own minds how to live our Catholic way of life.**
