

"The Best Gift We Have Received"

MERRY CHRISTMAS!

Christmas is always a time of joy and excitement. I am sure that all of us have many memories of Christmases past that bring happiness – watching a the amazement of a child as they experience their first

Christmas, the first Christmas of a newly married couple.

These memories are filled with family and friends, as will this Christmas be filled with them. Of course one of the main excitements of Christmas are the presents. They may become less the focus as we grow older, but do we ever get to the point when we don't like receiving presents? What was the greatest Christmas present that you ever received? What made it so special?

When I asked myself that question, to be honest, I had a difficult time coming up with an answer. I have received some memorable gifts, like the Evil Knievel "action figure" with stunt cycle. It was a lot of fun, and I played with it a lot – for maybe the first month – but it eventually ended up on the bottom of the toy chest, and then years later given away.

I also remember the Christmas that I received a book of envelopes. My parents had decided that I was old enough to start receiving an allowance, so they wanted me to learn how to budget my money – some was put into the envelop marked "Church," some into "Savings," etc. It probably was a gift that has taught me the most – I have since then been good about managing my money – but it was not much fun, so I wouldn't call it the best gift I ever received.

The greatest Christmas present that we have ever received is Jesus, the Word Made Flesh. Think about it, God so loved us that He sent His only Son to live with us. God does not need anything from us, so His love is totally a gift. Sadly, the "reason for the season," seems to be forgotten too often amidst the tinsel, eggnog, and wrapping paper.

Probably my most memorable Christmas, where I truly came to value the gift of the Christ Child, was my first Christmas as a priest. A month before I was diagnosed with cancer, and had two surgeries on my throat to remove the tumor. Christmas was my first Mass back, and I had the "Happy Birthday Jesus" Mass in the gym. I could barely talk, but I invited all the kids to join me in front of the Altar and shout "Alleluia" like the angels told the shepherds to do. And together, the children and I talked about the real reason for the joy of Christmas. The baby born in the manger, Jesus the Lord. After the Mass, the "C & E" Catholics complained that they had a hard time hearing me, while the "regulars" came and told me how they prayed me through the Mass, hoping my voice would hold out, and how marvelous it was. Since then, I have always valued the love of God, so often manifested through parishioners.

So, thank you for being the means through which I receive the greatest Christmas present: the Christ Child. I pray that Jesus will also be your greatest Christmas present; this year and always. MERRY CHRISTMAS!!!


Reflect on the Word of Jesus Christ December 25, 2016 Solemnity of the Lord

Christmas: No two families are the same and all families are welcome here at our parish. If this is your first time visiting us, welcome! Please consider celebrating Mass here with us again. We would love for your family to become part of our family here at Resurrection Parish.

Here at Resurrection Parish we are also are promoting "Building Strong Marriages," by offering a special anniversary blessing for couples celebrating their wedding anniversary each month. We ask couples who are celebrating an anniversary to let the parish office know by the last Monday of the month prior to their anniversary; for example, if your anniversary is in December, you would let the office know by the last Monday in November (however, since we are getting a late jump on this, just for December anniversaries, you have until the first Monday of December to let the office know). Let us know your name, your anniversary date (it is up to you if you want to include the year), and which Mass you generally attend. The second weekend of the month will be the weekend in which we celebrate all the anniversaries for that month. What Exactly Are Sacraments?















Sacraments are words and actions that make God present to us in a special way. Jesus gave us Sacraments so we can always feel his love for us. They also help us grow in Faith to become good followers of our Faith. We have seven Sacraments. They are pictured above. Can you name them?

The sacraments are instituted by Christ. Christ instituted all seven sacraments as ways in which He could be present to His people even after His Ascension into Heaven.

The sacraments are also entrusted to the Church. Christ gave the sacraments to the Church so that the Church could dispense them to the faithful.

The sacraments dispense divine life. People who receive the sacraments actually share in the divine life of God. His presence enters into their souls, He helps them to live the Christian life, and He saves them so that they may reach eternal life.

According to our Catholic faith, the sacraments are a gift from God, given through the Church as an outpouring of His love. Through the sacraments, God justifies and sanctifies His people (i.e., He saves them and makes them holy), He meets His people where they are in order to draw them up to Him, He pours out His grace, He builds up the Church and He receives worship.
