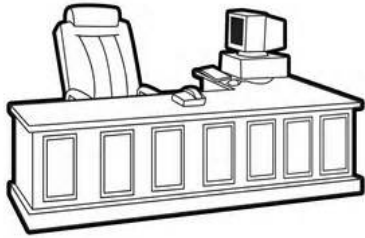

From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk "Things to Look Forward To"

The Church is often accused as being behind the times. However, for the Church, 2017 began about five weeks ago when we started the season of Advent. I guess, however, I will acquiesce to secular society and wish all of you a Happy New Year!

There are several things that we should be looking forward to, as a parish, in 2017. First, on January 25, the Bishop will make his decisions regarding "Faith in Our Future" known. Just to remind you, "Faith in Our Future" is the pastoral planning process that the Diocese started over a year ago. Each parish in the diocese has taken a hard, honest look at itself, and as small groups, called cohorts, to identify the pastoral needs that they will be face in the next 5-10 years, and how they can best address them. While a big reason for this process is the growing shortage of priests (about a third of the priests will reach retirement age in the next 5 years), "Faith in Our Future" has always been about more than that. It has been about how we can recognize the presence of Jesus Christ here in the Diocese of Trenton, and how we can better make His presence known. We are part of cohort 1, along with Jesus the Good Shepherd Parish (Riverside & Beverly), and Corpus Christi Parish (Willingboro). Once the Bishop makes his decisions known on January 25th, we will all have to work to implement those decisions in the best way possible. As the Bishop told us priests recently, "Change is coming. If we don't manage it, the change will manage us."

One of the needs that we, as a parish, identified last February in our parish survey, was a need to evangelize. That is a word that some Catholics are not comfortable with. They get images of going door to door, asking to tell people about Jesus. While that might be part of evangelization, it is not what we generally mean by the word. It means sharing the Good News, by inviting those who are not Churched, to "come and see." Hopefully, all of us can talk about why Jesus is importance to us. Since we want to see what the Bishop has in mind for our cohort, we probably will not get started with forming an evangelization plan until February, so stay tuned.

On January 26, at 7 PM in Room 8 of the Parish Center you are all invited to hear a presentation on parish pilgrimage that we are planning. This year will be the 100 th anniversary of Our Lady's apparition in Fatima. To celebrate this we are planning a trip, October 7-17. First we will go to Barcelona, then to Lourdes, and finally Fatima. The presentation will give details as to costs, what's included, and itinerary. I have never run a pilgrimage, so I am excited, so I hope you will consider joining me.

One thing that I am really looking forward to in 2017 is celebrating Easter with all of you. Last year, I was still recovering from my medical complications. Easter is my favorite time, so I was sad to just have to sit on the sidelines for Holy Week. This year we look forward to welcoming two new members into the Church. 2017 is going to be a terrific year.

Today we celebrate not simply a new calendar year, but the wonderful role of Mary as the Mother of God. Mary was the first disciple and she remains the greatest intercessor for us, adopted children of a loving Father. As you contemplate the start of a new year, invite the Blessed Mother to be a welcome guest and model within your home. All parents are encouraged to ask the Blessed Virgin each day to keep their family under her powerful protection.

Here at Resurrection Parish we are also promoting “Building Strong Marriages,” by offering a special anniversary blessing for couples celebrating their wedding anniversary each month. We ask couples who are celebrating an anniversary to let the parish office know by the last Monday of the month prior to their anniversary; for example, if your anniversary is in December, you would let the office know by the last Monday in November (however, since we are getting a late jump on this, just for December anniversaries, you have until the first Monday of December to let the office know). Let us know your name, your anniversary date (it is up to you if you want to include the year), and which Mass you generally attend. The second weekend of the month will be the weekend in which we celebrate all the anniversaries for that month. We will have all the month’s anniversaries listed in the bulletin, and at each Mass that weekend we will have a pew reserved for the couples. After the homily, the couples will be invited to stand for a renewal of their commitment to each other which is in the new “Order of Celebrating Matrimony” that the Church just published. We will have a card for the couple with the “Renewal of Commitment” prayer that the couple will say. Then, after the Our Father, the priest will give the couple a special blessing.

The public witness of the couple’s faithful, permanent, and fruitful love for each other is a tremendous service to the whole Church as it testifies to Christ’s own love for the Church. We are all looking forward to celebrating matrimony each month.

Teaching Our Children

Teaching Children About Mary. The Mother of God!

Although Jesus said, ‘woman, my time hasn’t yet come’ (to perform miracles), Mary knew that her son would not disregard her request to provide wine for the wedding. She goes on to tell the servants "do whatever he tells you". **The first**

miracle of Jesus is carried out at Mary’s request.

As in the story above, even today Mary through all her apparitions around the world leads us to Jesus and requests us to do whatever Jesus asks of us. Even through the Rosary, **Mary leads us to Jesus, by reflecting upon the beautiful mysteries of Jesus’ life.**

Teach our children to ask Mary to pray for us. We believe that Jesus is God and therefore, Mary is the ‘Mother of God’ as in the beautiful Hail Mary Prayer.

When Jesus was on the cross, he asked his friend to take Mary as his mother and for His mother to accept His friend as her son (the Gospel of John chapter 19 verses 25-27). This request from Jesus conveys two messages.

Jesus wants us, his friends to take His mother as ‘Our Mother.’

He also showed us, how much he cared for his mother, because he did not want to leave her by herself.
