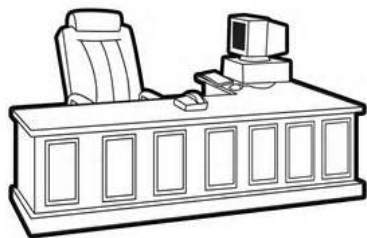

From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk "What is a Cathedral?"

Recently it was announced that St. Robert Bellarmine Church, in Freehold, has been raised to the dignity of the Co-Cathedral for the Diocese of Trenton. In his letter announcing the elevation of St. Robert Bellarmine to that of Co-Cathedral, Bishop David O'Connell noted that two years ago he had moved the annual Chrism Mass, at which all the priests of the Diocese renew their priestly promises, to St. Robert because its size

and location better served the needs of that Mass. St. Robert Bellarmine Church is pretty much in the geographical center of the Diocese and is easily accessible from major freeways. This is why several other Diocesan events have also been moved to St. Robert Bellarmine; such as the annual Marriage Anniversary Blessing Mass.

This news allows for a "teachable" moment; just what is a cathedral? Simply, a cathedral is the chief church in a diocese. While the diocesan bishop is at home at all the parishes within his diocese, the cathedral is his parish, and it should be located near his residence. Since the bishop is technically the "pastor" of the cathedral, the priest who administers the day-to-day affairs of the cathedral is called the rector. The name "cathedral" comes from Greek, "kathedra," which is the word for "throne." In the cathedral is the bishop's chair (throne) in which only he sits at liturgical celebrations. The "cathedra" or Bishop's chair, is the symbol of the Bishop's authority in his diocese. The cathedral of a diocese is established by the Holy See, and it cannot be changed to another city without the Holy See's approval.

After the fire destroyed the Cathedral of St. Mary Assumption in Trenton in the late 1950s, St. Anthony Church in Trenton was made the temporary cathedral as St. Mary Assumption was being rebuilt. Since this move was within the same city, and was temporary, it did not need the approval of the Holy See, but the bishop did consult with the priests.

Likewise, about a year ago, Bishop O'Connell wrote to the priests of the Diocese to hear their thoughts on making St. Robert Bellarmine the Co-Cathedral for the Diocese of Trenton. After receiving strong support from the priests of the Diocese, Bishop O'Connell sent a proposal to the Congregation for Bishops in Rome. Cardinal Oulette, the Head of that Congregation, asked some questions, and after receiving the answers, approved the proposal in early December, 2016.

What does all this mean for us in the Diocese of Trenton? First off, St. Mary Assumption, in Trenton, remains the Mother Church of the Diocese of Trenton. Ordinations and other Diocesan events will continue to be celebrated there. However, as Co-Cathedral for the Diocese of Trenton, St. Robert Bellarmine will also be the home for some Diocesan celebrations, such as the Chrism Mass. A "cathedra" or Bishop's chair will be placed in St. Robert Bellarmine, as one will continue to remain in St. Mary Assumption. To be honest, I don't know if this means that Msgr. Sam Siriani, the pastor of St. Robert Bellarmine, will become a rector. I think so.

We are doubly blessed in our Diocese for having both St. Mary Assumption in Trenton, and St. Robert Bellarmine in Freehold to be our Diocesan "homes" for liturgical celebrations.

Here at Resurrection Parish we are also promoting “Building Strong Marriages,” by offering a special anniversary blessing for couples celebrating their wedding anniversary each month. We ask couples who are celebrating an anniversary to let the parish office know by the last Monday of the month prior to their anniversary; for example, if your anniversary is in December, you would let the office know by the last Monday in November. Let us know your name, your anniversary date (it is up to you if you want to include the year), and which Mass you generally attend. The second weekend of the month will be the weekend in which we celebrate all the anniversaries for that month. We will have all the month’s anniversaries listed in the bulletin, and at each Mass that weekend we will have a pew reserved for the couples. After the homily, the couples will be invited to stand for a renewal of their commitment to each other which is in the new “Order of Celebrating Matrimony” that the Church just published. We will have a card for the couple with the “Renewal of Commitment” prayer that the couple will say. Then, after the *Our Father*, the priest will give the couple a special blessing.

Tidbits on Confirmation

Involving the Spirit - In the Roman Rite, the bishop extends his hands over all to be confirmed. From the apostolic age this gesture has signified the gift of the Spirit. He then invokes the Holy Spirit. "Send your Holy Spirit upon them to be their helper and guide."

Essential Rite - The essential rite follows, that is the anointing with chrism on the forehead and the words, "Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit."

Effects of Confirmation

Confirmation's effect is the full outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Therefore, Confirmation:

1. Increases and deepens baptismal grace
2. Causes us to cry out "Abba, Father"
3. Unites us more firmly to Christ
4. Increases the Spirit's gifts
5. Bonds us more to the Church
6. Strengthens us to proclaim our faith boldly

"Recall then that you have received the spiritual seal. God the Father has marked you. Christ the Lord has confirmed you and placed the Spirit in your hearts." (St. Ambrose).
