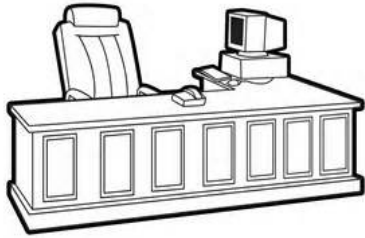

From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk

"Say only the good things people need to hear..."

"No foul language should come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for needed edification, that it may impart grace to those who hear" (Ephesians 4:29)

The gift of speech is one of the most important graces that God has given us. Actually, when I say "speech" and really mean the ability to communicate, for there are many ways in which we can communicate: the spoken word, the written word, and even sign language. And it includes social media like FaceBook, Twitter, Snapchat. Like all of God's gifts to us, the gift of speech/communication should only be used according to God's plan, and there are two main reasons God has given us the gift of communication.

First, and the highest purpose, of speech is to give praise and thanksgiving to God. Literally, every beat of our heart, every breath that we take is gift from God, so we can never thank Him enough. God created us to be in communion with Him, and He knows that our ultimate happiness will be to be one with Him for eternity. The word "communion" means "with union" and communication is the means by which such oneness is achieved. While God does not need our thanksgiving or praise, the action of thanking God and praising Him brings us into closer union with Him, thus moves us closer to our ultimate happiness.

As God is a community of Three Divine Persons - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit - God created us to also live in community, and not just with Him, but with each other. Therefore, the other purpose of the gift of speech/communication is to build one another up. True charity is helping the other person achieve their ultimate destiny, which is heaven. That is what St. Paul was talking about when he wrote the passage above to the Ephesians. He knew that saying good things, things that would build people up was the best way of building the Kingdom of God here on earth. At the same time, and this was a problem among the Ephesians, gossip and other malice speech was the surest way of tearing a community apart.

I decided to address this, because our community is also being effected by "foul language," that is talk that is not "needed for edification." We all know the joke about the gossip at ShopRite, but it really is not a joke.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "Respect for the reputation of persons forbids every attitude and word likely to cause them unjust injury. He becomes guilty:

- of rash judgment who, even tacitly, assumes as true, without sufficient foundation, the moral fault of a neighbor;
- of detraction who, without objectively valid reason, discloses another's faults and failings to persons who did not know them;
- of calumny who, by remarks contrary to the truth, harms the reputation of others and gives occasion for false judgments concerning them" (CCC #2477).

So the next time we are in ShopRite or on FaceBook, let us heed the advice of St. Ignatius of Loyola, "Every good Christian ought to be more ready to give a favorable interpretation to another's statement than to condemn it. But if he cannot do so, let him ask how the other understands it. And if the latter understands it badly, let the former correct him with love. If that does not suffice, let the Christian try all suitable ways to bring the other to a correct interpretation so that he may be saved." (The Spiritual Exercises, #22).

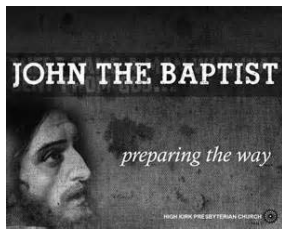

Renewal of Baptismal Promises

After the homily the candidates (Confirmation Class) stand and the Celebrant questions them:

Priest: Do you reject Satan and all his works and all his empty promises?

Candidates: *I do.*



Priest: Do you believe in God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth?

Candidates: *I do*

Priest: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, was crucified, died, and was buried, rose from the dead, and is now seated at the right hand of the Father?

Candidates: *I do.*

Priest: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who came upon the apostles at Pentecost and today is given to you sacramentally in confirmation?

Candidates: *I do.*

Priest: Do you believe in the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting?

Candidates: *I do.*

Priest: This is our faith. This is the faith of the Church. We are proud to profess it in Christ Jesus our Lord. *Amen*
