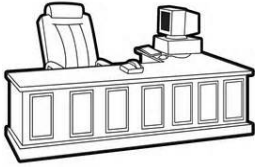

From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk "Praying for Life"

About 8 years ago, the parish I was at had a spiritual adoption program. Participants in the Spiritual Adoption Program pledge to pray for nine months for a baby in danger of abortion. While this child will remain unknown to his or her 'spiritual parent', God knows who the child is. The children were even given names, and the baby I adopted was named "Joseph." I prayed for Joseph every day, but of course never thought that I would ever meet my "Joseph."

Two months later, I had a very bad day. The office was finally closed, and I was looking forward to some quiet time alone in prayer. Then the doorbell rang. Part of me said, "Ignore it, the office is closed. They can come back tomorrow." But I am a priest, so I went down and let in a woman who was clearly upset.

She was a married woman, mother of 4 children, and about 40 years old. She had recently found out that she was pregnant with twins (another set of twins). That was surprising enough for her and her husband, but she had just come from the doctor, and the one child, the boy, showed signs of "problems." Her doctor was advising her to "reduce" the pregnancy, which meant aborting the little boy. She did not know what to do. They were good Catholics who went to Mass every week, and did their best to raise their kids in the Faith. But what was she to do now? They were not intending to have more children, and now there were "problems" with the pregnancy. She was about 40 years old, so it would already be a risky pregnancy. What should she do?

Of course she knew the Church's teaching about abortion being an intrinsic evil. We prayed together for awhile, and I listened to her. She said that she would go home and discuss things with her husband. I promised that I would pray for her. As she left, I knew that I had just met my "Joseph," so I really stepped up the prayers.

Maybe a week later, the woman and her husband stopped me after Mass, and told me that they had decided to keep both babies. Whether God gave them their son for an hour or for years, they would love him and his sister for as long as they lived. As I told them how happy I was and told them about me feeling that their son was my "Joseph" from the Spiritual Adoption Program, they smiled. They told me that they had already decided to name the boy, Dante Joseph.

Dante, and his sister Giana, were born a few months later, in August. They were not sure if Dante would live, so he was baptized immediately. He could not come home until December 8 (the day our Spiritual Adoption Program celebrated the birth of our kids), but had to be rushed back to the hospital on Christmas Eve. He would not come home again until Mother's Day. Just about on his and Giana's first birthday, I baptized Giana, with her brother right there. They are now 7 years old.

Today we remember a terrible tragedy in our country; the anniversary of Roe v. Wade, when the Supreme Court legalized abortion. That decision has resulted in millions of deaths of innocent children through the evil of abortion. Today is a day in which we need to offer special prayers for life, for the greater respect of human life, from conception until natural death. Some see this as a "holy" war, the work to make abortion illegal. Yet war is never "holy." We must stand up to the "culture of death" and abortion, but by being Witnesses of Hope. That is what I offered Dante's mother when things were looking hopeless. Our battle for life can only be "Won by Love," which is the title of an amazing book, an autobiography of Norma McCovey, the "Jane Roe" in Roe v. Wade. It chronicles her journey from the pro-abortion camp to her conversion to Christ. It was through the love of a child and her mother. I highly recommend it.

In March, we will be starting our own Spiritual Adoption Program, Deacon Jim and Barbara Szyszkiewicz, our parish Respect Life coordinator. In addition to committing to pray for our "babies," we hope to have a baby bottle drive to raise money for Good Counsel Home, and maybe have a "baby shower" to collect baby supplies for the women there, and we can invite them to the party. Maybe we can get some of them to share their experience of being pregnant, sharing information about the development of a child in the womb. I hope that all of you will adopt a baby, and pray, pray, pray. It is through love and prayer that we can convert our nation to a "Culture of Life" instead of a "Culture of Death."

Christ Our Light



We know that Jesus has many names. Today we remember that Christ is our "Light." This beautiful image is one that gives us hope and joy. Jesus' ministry begins with a call to repent and change our lives so the light of the Kingdom of Heaven can shine through us onto the whole world.

If you are in a dark place, even a small light makes your surroundings less threatening. But the quote from Isaiah doesn't say that the people who sat in darkness saw a small light; he says it is a **great light! The light that Christ brings overcomes all darkness.** We can think of darkness figuratively, such as loneliness, sickness, hunger, fear or worry/insecurity, etc. Christ's light is stronger than all if these, It is stronger than even the **greatest darkness... death itself.**

When Jesus began his work on earth it was **the beginning of the Kingdom of God among us.** People had been waiting and hoping for the Messiah, this great light, for a long time. **Matthew has an important word in this Gospel passage. He says the light everyone has been waiting for has "arisen."**



Adult: This week, bring the **Light of Christ** to someone in need! **Do not be afraid! Jesus will bless your efforts.**

Child: What changes can you make, this week, to bring someone the light of Christ to a friend. Try it, just once!
