## From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk "Faith in Our Future"

"Change is coming. We can either manage the change, or the change will manage us."

- Bishop David O'Connell

As I write this, I am waiting for "a shoe to drop." By the time you read this, the "shoe" will have already dropped. The "shoe" is Bishop O'Connell's decision in regard to the "Faith In Our Future" Diocesan Planning project.

Just to review, a little over a year ago, all the parishes in the Diocese, as well as other Diocesan ministries (e.g., school, prison, college ministries), started looking at what they were doing well, where they needed improvement, and what they saw would be needed in the future. All this was done in light of the projected resources the Diocese would have in the future (i.e., nearly a third of the priests are due to retire in the next 5 years). The process started at the parish level, and then moved to cohorts of parishes. Initial recommendations were sent to the Diocesan Planning Committee (DPC) last June, and last September the parishes received the preliminary recommendations for our feedback. After receiving the feedback from the cohorts, the DPC made final recommendations to Bishop O'Connell, shortly before Thanksgiving. The Bishop consulted with the priests of the Diocese, on a county level, in December. On Wednesday, January 25, 2017 Bishop O'Connell announces his finally decisions. We will have a special edition of the Monitor in the churches with the Bishop's decisions.

Change is difficult, but it is a constant in life. We cannot avoid it, and it is better that we are pro-active in facing changes. I am appointing a committee of parishioners who will manage the changes that are coming for Resurrection Parish, according to the Bishop's decisions. I hope that we will take this as an opportunity for us to renew ourselves as God's people, and recommit ourselves to living out the mission Jesus entrusted to us, to "go make disciples of all the nations."

In order to implement the Diocesan Plan which the Bishop has developed from the "Faith In Our Future" project, the Diocese has also been conducting a "Faith To Move Mountains" endowment campaign. This will provide the Diocese and parishes with the financial resources that will be needed to implement "Faith In Our Futures."

"Faith To Move Mountains" has a goal of raising \$75 million, 30% of which will stay in the local parishes. So far the Diocese has over \$55 million in pledges. The endowment campaign has been being rolled out in 4 Blocks. Resurrection Parish is in Block 4, which started last Fall. Some of you may have already been contacted by myself or others in the parish about making a gift.

Next weekend, at all the Masses, we will view a video which will explain all that "Faith To Move Mountains" will fund. The following weekend, we will have our "commitment weekend," were all of us will be asked to make a sacrificial gift, over 3 to 5 years, to fund the endowment. This gift is in addition to our weekly offering to the parish, and the Annual Catholic Appeal. Notice, I have been saying "our" and "we": I also make a donation each week to the parish, each month to the Annual Catholic Appeal, and now quarterly to "Faith To Move Mountains." I know that it can be tough, but not nearly as much as what Christ suffered for us on the Cross.

As we begin to implement "Faith In Our Future," and "Faith To Move Mountains" I ask that all of us be open to the movement of the Holy Spirit, who is always patient, generous, and courageous.

## Reflect on the Word of Jesus Christ January 29, 2017

What is you "B-Attitude"?



Hearing the Beatitude's and Living them, are two different things!
Which Beatitude do you already practice! How often? These words come directly from

Jesus, do you dare to ignore them? He is telling us how God wants us to act. When Jesus talks about being happy he is speaking about making others happy. He wants us to be happy or joyful even when things seem sad or hard. He says we should be happy even when we are mourning for someone.. We are blessed when we show mercy or when we are humble or when we try to become a peacemaker.

Whenever we do these things we are not just working with our own power, we are relying on God We are saying that no



matter what happens we can trust that God will be with us and help us to be the best person we can be. Jesus is telling us, from the top of that mountain, that we can trust his word. We want God to be able to trust us to form a **good attitude** that helps us become more like Jesus.

Adult: When an announcement is made from a mountain, we know Jesus is saying "Listen, this is something important! You need to know and remember! Most important I need to teach my children Jesus' ways.

<u>Child:</u> Jesus is telling us from the top of that mountain that we can trust his word.




