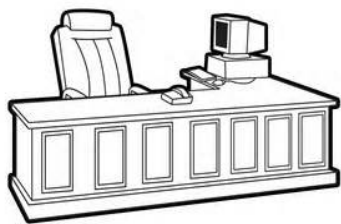

## From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk "From the Mail Bag"

The other week I received a letter from a parishioner that saddened me. She and her family like to go to Mass together. It is not just their immediate family, but the extended family – children, grandchildren, aunts and uncles, cousins. This is absolutely wonderful; as they say, “a family that prays together, stays together.” Unfortunately, at a recent Mass, they were made to feel unwelcomed by some parishioners who made comments to the effect of, “Look, the whole family is here and they are taking our seats.” Instead of rejoicing in seeing a family that prays together, they were greeted with annoyance because they were “taking up the pew.”

Let me be clear, while I understand that we tend to be creatures of habit so may have a favorite spot to sit, besides the priest and deacon, no one has assigned seats in the church (with a few exceptions for special occasions). Hospitality was one of the most important virtues for the Chosen People, as members of Christ's Mystical Body, hospitality should continue to be one of the most important virtues for all of us. We should go out of our way to make people feel welcomed in our parish, even if they are sitting in our “favorite” pew.

It reminds me of a song from the Christian group Mercy Me. It tells of a stranger coming into the church and because of the judging faces of the “regulars,” the newcomer sat in the back feeling very unwelcomed. I sure do hope that this will not be the environment that newcomers find here at Resurrection Parish.

It has also been observed by several people, that there is a lot of talking going on in the pews before Mass. As one parishioner mentioned to me, “I now know more about the medical history of the people sitting in front of me, than I do about my own family's medical history.” We need to find the proper balance for the good, community building sharing that shows our loving concern for each other, and reverential prayer.

Fortunately, the structure of church buildings – drawing on the example of the ancient Temple in Jerusalem – provides for this balance. Church buildings almost always have a narthex or “gathering space” in the back of the church. Some are bigger than others; at Holy Name we have the hallway and now the library, while St. Casimir has just the entrance space. It is in the narthex or “gathering space” that it is fitting for there to be some community building, charitable conversation; greeting friends and family, a brief catching up on how each are doing. Once, however, we enter into the main body of the church we should shift to a more prayerful silence.

Arriving early is a perfect way to prayerfully form one's intention for the Mass, to bring one's needs to God, and to mindfully thank God for all the blessings that He has given us during the past week. It is a time to move ourselves from “city of the world” to the “city of God.”

Obviously, there will not be perfect, prayerful silence in the church before and after Mass, but we should all do our best to respect the prayer of those in the church proper.

# Reflect on the Word of Jesus Christ

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Your Light, Yes You...Must Shine Before Others



Salt and lamps are pretty common items, even in Jesus' time. Jesus always used objects that are familiar to us to teach us something about God's Kingdom or our place in it.

Let's think about salt first. In the days of Jesus, salt was very important. It was one of the ways that people were able to preserve food and add flavor to it. We still use salt for the same reasons today. Jesus is saying we must exhibit the same qualities as salt. **We should help preserve what is good in us and in other people. We should add flavor to life. We should teach people about Jesus Christ and them teach them to go out and spread his word.**

Jesus also compares us to a lamp or a light. Where does he say a lamp belongs? "On a lamp stand, not under a bushel basket. **Our light is our many talents. The things we can do, We should recognize them, strengthen them, and then use them in service of God.**



**Adult:** Our light cannot shine in a vacuum. We are called to *bring that light, that Light of Christ, to the very places in the world that needs it most.* Those places that need to know the Light of Jesus Christ. Start in your own Family and Parish give them the gift of your Light of Christ!

**Child:** *Me? I have to spread the Light of Christ?* Yes, you bet! Be salt (add flavor) be gentle, kind, don't yell or gossip! Invite friends to Mass and Faith Formation!

Right Judgment, or Counsel, is the gift of prudence. The gift of right judgment helps you make choices to live as a faithful follower of Jesus.

Courage, or Fortitude, is the gift that helps you stand up for your faith in Christ. The gift of courage helps you overcome any obstacles that would keep you from practicing your faith.

Knowledge is the gift of knowing and enlightenment. The gift of knowledge enables you to choose the right path that will lead you to God. It encourages you to avoid obstacles that will keep you from him.

Reverence, or Piety, is the gift of confidence in God. This gift of reverence inspires you to joyfully want to serve God and others.



Wonder and Awe, or Fear of the Lord is the gift of wonder and respect that encourages you to be in awe of God. The gift of wonder and awe moves you to so love God that you do not want to offend him by your words or actions.
