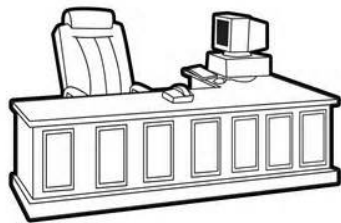

From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk "Do Not Neglect Hospitality"

"Do not neglect hospitality, for through it some have unknowingly entertained angels." (Hebrews 13:2)

It seems as if my column last week was appropriately timed. After writing it, a few days later in prayer I read the above passage from the Letter to the Hebrews. My column also, unfortunately, brought some other stories of a lack of hospitality at our parish.

One person came to me after one of the Masses to tell me that they had invited some friends to go to the 12th Night/Oplatek Dinner. The friends are not members of our parish, but decided to go to the 5 PM Mass before going to the dinner. After seating themselves, and starting to pray quietly, some people came in and told them to move because they were sitting in their seats.

Again, besides the priest and the deacon, there are no assigned seats in the church. These people came to support a parish fundraiser, and were made to feel unwelcomed. We really need to learn the lesson of hospitality.

One of the best example of hospitality can be found in Genesis 18:1-8. I will not quote the whole passage – your homework is to read it on your own – but in summary, when Abraham was near the oak of Mamre, from his tent, he noticed three men passing by. Immediately Abraham ran to them, and invited them to rest themselves in his camp. As water was brought so that the guests could wash their feet, Abraham had food and drink prepared for them. They had not asked Abraham for anything, rather he had anticipated their needs. At the end of the encounter, we discover that the three men are the LORD (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) – Abraham had done more than just entertained angels, he had actually entertained God.

In the next few months we are going to have to really practice hospitality as I suspect we are going to be welcoming a good number of new people. In the past week or so, we have had several people register in the parish from Jesus the Good Shepherd because they are upset that St. Peter's church is going to be closed. While we are not going to encourage people who worshiped at St. Peter's to join our parish (they still belong to Jesus the Good Shepherd), at the same time we will welcome them if they do decide to come here. Like Abraham, we will need to anticipate their needs. And what they are going to need is compassion.

Just this past week, I was having breakfast with the local Grand Knight at Golden River Diner in Riverside, when a woman came up to me very upset that St. Peter's is going to close. She asked if there is anything that can be done to stop it. I listened to her stories of the many family events that were celebrated there in St. Peter's, and the generations of her family who have worshiped there. While empathizing with her sadness – grief really – I also reminded her that the Church is more than bricks and mortar, and that the wonderful community of prayer that was St. Peter's, and then joined with another wonderful community of prayer that was St. Joseph's in Beverly to become Jesus the Good Shepherd Parish would continue, and she should continue to participate there.

In the coming weeks, as I am sure many of us will meet more people grieving the close of St. Peter's in the near future, we all need to be good, hospitable Christian neighbors to them. Listen to their sadness, reassure them of the love of Christ and His Church, and if they decide to come here, to welcome them in our pews, our ministries, and our lives – for we may very well be entertaining angels.

If we listen to Jesus' examples today we learn that doing the minimum is not how we should live our lives. An example...it seems impossible that

anyone we know would ever consider killing another person and Jesus' knows that is true of most people so he challenges us to be better to go further by saying that we should really try to avoid even being angry or hurting another... even if it is "just" a rude remark. Have you noticed for quite a while now **how mean people talk to each other?**



That is a way of "killing someone", think about how very sad you have made someone with a thoughtless remark. Think about how you would feel.... then try to be kind and loving to everyone including the grouchiest person you know.. **Be different - be better than the "world"!!**

Child: I was with a group of friends the other day in the Mall. They were making fun of a teenager that walked by that did not have "the best of clothes". How mean they were. I did not speak up and I felt so bad. "Forgive me Jesus"!!

What Happens During the Examination of Conscience?



When we prepare to
receive the Sacrament of
Reconciliation, we
examine our conscience.
Just as God gives us the
gift of free will, he also
gives us the gift of
conscience. Conscience

helps us to know the difference between right and
wrong, good and evil. It also helps us to know
whether something we already did was right or
wrong. We need to pray and learn Jesus' teachings
to make our conscience strong. This will help our
conscience point us in the right direction.

**Here are some questions that we ask ourselves
during the examination of conscience:**

Did I live as Jesus wants me to?

Did I go to Mass on Sunday?

Did I love and respect my family members?

Did I share my time and things with others?

**Did I tell the truth, return things that belong to
others?**

**Did I tell the truth, return others' belongings and
treat people fairly?**
