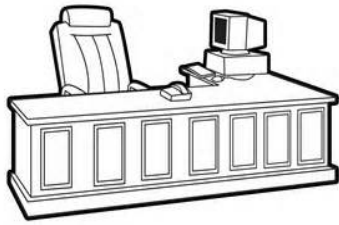

From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk

"How Do We Make Christ the Life of Our Soul?"

April 2, 2017

Last week I mentioned that Blessed Dom. Columba Marmion published three major works; *Christ the Life of the Soul* (1917), *Christ in His Mysteries* (1919), and *Christ the Life of the Monk* (1922). These three books, unfolds folding of Marmion's central teaching on divine sonship.

Last week I summarized his first book, *Christ the Life of the Soul*, which expounds on his central theme that Christ is the life of our soul, and that we have to move away from our own ideas of holiness, of our own plans, and accept God's plan to give us holiness, in and through Christ, who is the "source" and "dispenser" of holiness. Dom. Marmion relates that a central point of our reception of God's divine life stems from our adoption as sons (and daughters) in the Son.

The question then becomes, "How is Christ the life of the soul?" This is the theme taken up in his second book, *Christ in His Mysteries*. St. Paul describes how "by reading what I have written, you can recognize the understanding I have of the mystery of Christ" (Eph 3:4). What is this mystery of Christ? Dom. Marmion paraphrases St. Paul in saying, "Nothing but Christ, and Christ crucified."

The mysteries of the life of Christ reveal to us the mystery of Christ. The contemplation of these mysteries, in Scripture and through the liturgy, provide us access to these mysteries so that we can mystically conform ourselves to Christ. The mysteries are not theoretical, but opportunities to conform to Christ, the goal of Marmion's spirituality. "The more we know Christ," he says, "the more deeply we fathom the mysteries of His Person, and of His life, the more we prayerfully study the circumstances and details that Revelation has confided in us – the more, also, our piety be true, and our holiness has solidity" (Marmion, *Christ in His Mysteries*).

The Mystery of Christ Jesus is too much for us finite humans to take in all at once. That is why Jesus reveals Himself to us in a multitude of mysteries. "We shall see that each one of His mysteries contains its own teaching, brings its special life; is for our souls the source of a particular grace, the object of which is to 'form Jesus in us'" (Marmion, *Christ in His Mysteries*). The mysteries of Christ provide the means by which we enter into God's life. We are conformed not only to the humanity of Christ, but even to His divinity through the mysteries: "This is why our imitation of Christ should extend not only to his human virtues, but also to his divine being" (Marmion, *Christ in His Mysteries*).

"The mysteries of Christ are ours; the union that Jesus Christ wishes to contract with us is one in which everything He has becomes ours. With a divine liberality, He wants us to share in the inexhaustible graces of salvation and sanctification that He has merited for us by each of His mysteries, so as to communicate to us the spirit of His states and thus to bring about in each of us a resemblance to Him – the infallible pledge of our destiny planned from eternity. Christ has passed through diverse states; He has been a child, an adolescent, a teacher of the truth, a victim on the cross, glorious in His resurrection and ascension. By thus going through all the successive stages of His earthly existence, He has sanctified the whole of human life" (Marmion, *Christ in His Mysteries*).

Fifth Sunday of Lent

John 11:3-7,17 20-27,31-45

Do You Believe?



Martha, Mary, and Lazarus were friends of Jesus, because they were all believers, he did not have to convince them that he was who he said he was..as Martha says, "I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God." But as with many believers

sometimes, faith in God is shaken when someone dies. Some people ask questions like. "Why did he die so young?" or "Why did this good person have to die"? They wonder if Jesus is really who he says he is, our Savior.

Some people cannot help but have this reaction because they are very sad and in mourning. They are unable, in this very sad time, to stop thinking about how much they will miss this person. Jesus challenges these thoughts in today's Gospel. It is of course natural and understandable to be sad when someone close to us dies....**but if the person who died is a disciple and has lived a life of following the teachings of Jesus, wouldn't he or she enter eternal life like Jesus said they would do? This is what we must remember at this time. God is with us in our sadness.**



Adult: I believe Jesus, I am so sorry for the times I have expressed doubt in you!

Child: Pray for me Jesus when someone dies. I am not very brave and I get so very sad and sometimes angry at you.

Yes, Lord! I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God

The-Shoe-That-Grows

Did you know that there are 300 million children in the world that do not have the basic foot protection that shoes provide? Kenton Lee found this out first hand when in 2007 he was doing some missionary work in Kenya. When he came back to the United States, he decide that he wanted to do something about that.

With the help of a former shoe designer for Nike, Kenton designed "The-Shoe-That-Grows." It is a sandal type shoe that can be adjust to fit 5 different shoe sizes, and to last at least 5 years. That way as a child grows, the shoe can be adjusted to grow with them. They come in 3 sizes - Small (toddler size 10 to kid's/women's size 2, or EUR 27-33), Large (kid's/women size 1.5 to 7.5 or EUR 33 to 38), and Adult (women's 7/men's 6 to men's size 12 or EUR 38 to 45).

Mr. Lee formed a company, Because International, to help distribute the shoes. They sell the shoes here, for \$50/pair, but for each pair sold they donate two pairs to those in need. So you really are getting three pairs of shoes for \$50; one for yourself and two for those who are poor.

I bought a pair in January, and wore them during my vacation. Now I am going to be participating in Because International's annual fundraiser, "Wear-A-Pair." I will be wearing my pair every day from April 3 to April 9 (at least part of the day). And I have set up a fundraiser page at: https://fundraise.theshoethatgrows.org/fundraiser/920416?is_new=true

THE GIFT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

We are not alone as we live out our lives as children of God. In Baptism the Holy Spirit comes to dwell in us.

What a wonderful gift!

Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we are

filled with God's life to heal us from sin and make us holy. We call this life sanctifying grace.



The Greek word used in the Scriptures to describe the Holy Spirit is parakletos. This Greek word is translated into latin, using the word consolator or paracletus. In English it is translated as paraclete, advocate or intercessor, teacher, helper, comforter, and consolor.

An advocate is someone who supports us and acts on our behalf. Advocates actively encourage us to accomplish our goals. They are on and at our side. In the Holy Spirit we have a wise companion and an advocate to journey with us.
