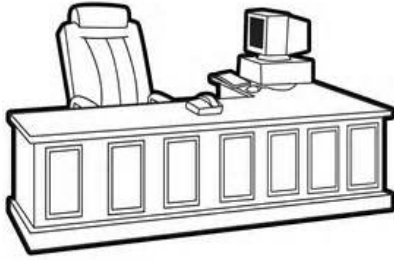

## From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk "Easter is a Time of Joy"

We were created for joy. You never hear someone say, "You know, this whole joy thing is not for me. I wish I had a little bit more misery in my life."

We are created for joy, but we come to realize that it's not something we can just buy at the local Wal-Mart. Think about the most joyful moments of your life. Isn't it true that they were a surprise?

Consider the surprise of discovering the empty tomb. Mary Magdalene had been there at the foot of the Cross. She had seen Jesus die. So Mary Magdalene was not expecting an empty tomb. So when she sees the empty tomb she doesn't know what to make of it. So she runs and tells Peter and John. They both run to the tomb. Apparently John had been more faithful to his Insanity workouts than Peter, and he beat him to the tomb. He looks in, and then he waits for Peter.

Peter was appointed the first Pope and so John wanted to let him go in first. Peter enters the tomb, and then John goes in. What they saw surprised them. Or better said, what they didn't see surprised them. The body of Jesus was gone. The burial clothing was there, but the body was gone. Imagine their surprise. What has happened here?

And then the gospel says that John saw and believed. He believed that Jesus had risen from the dead! The surprise must have overwhelmed him. But as he began to believe, he was filled with joy.

Joy is the best response to Easter. Who could have ever imagined that death could be conquered? That's what Easter means. Your death and my death is not the end. Just as Jesus rose from the dead we will rise from the dead. Body and soul, we will live forever.

Suffering does not have the last word. Death does not have the last word. The love of God, given to us in Jesus Christ has the last word.

This is why the psalm for Easter Sunday shouts out: "This is the day the Lord has made, let us REJOICE and be glad!" On Easter, we also are surprised by the presence of the Risen Jesus. And we too are filled with Joy.

When we realize the gift of Easter, joy is the best response.

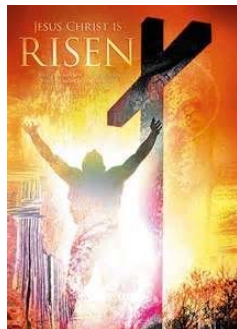
John 20: 1-9

## The-Shoe-That-Grows

Did you know that there are 300 million children in the world that do not have the basic foot protection that shoes provide? Kenton Lee found this out first hand when in 2007 he was doing some missionary work in Kenya. When he came back to the United States, he decided that he wanted to do something about that.

With the help of a former shoe designer for Nike, Kenton designed "The-Shoe-That-Grows." It is a sandal type shoe that can be adjusted to fit 5 different shoe sizes, and to last at least 5 years. That way as a child grows, the shoe can be adjusted to grow with them. They come in 3 sizes - Small (toddler size 10 to kid's/women's size 2, or EUR 27-33), Large (kid's/women size 1.5 to 7.5 or EUR 33 to 38), and Adult (women's 7/men's 6 to men's size 12 or EUR 38 to 45).

Mr. Lee formed a company, Because International, to help distribute the shoes. They sell the shoes here, for \$50/pair, but for each pair sold they donate two pairs to those in need. So you really are getting three pairs of shoes for \$50; one for yourself and two for those who are poor.

I bought a pair in January, and wore them during my vacation and I participated in Because International's annual fundraiser, "Wear-A-Pair." I wore my pair every day from April 3 to April 9 (at least part of the day). To be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, you must:

1. Not be the parent of the child/candidate
2. Must be at least 16 years of age
3. A Roman Catholic who has received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation.
4. A registered member of a parish.
5. A practicing Catholic, who participates at Mass, receives Reconciliation regularly and believes and lives according to the teachings of the Church.
6. (If married) Must be married according to the laws of the Catholic Church and living in a valid marriage. Persons who are divorced but not remarried outside the Church and not living with someone outside of marriage, are eligible.

#### Confirmation Class



The anointing with chrism and the accompanying words, express clearly the effect of giving of the Holy Spirit. Signed with the perfumed oil, the Baptized receive the indelible character, the seal of the

Lord, together with the Holy Spirit that conforms them more closely to Christ and gives them the grace of spreading the sweet odor of Christ." The Deacon brings the Chrism to the priest. Each candidate goes to the priest The sponsor that presented the candidate places his right hand on the on the candidates shoulder and gives the candidates name to the presider.

Presider: Dips his thumb in the Chrism Oil and makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of the candidate and gives his name or reads the name on the candidate name tag. "Name, be sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit"

Newly Confirmed: "AMEN" loud and clear without shouting.

Presider: Peace be with you.

Newly Confirmed: "And also with you." (loud and clear without shouting!!)

The liturgy continues with the Baptismal Vows. Please state loud clear (without shouting) "I Do".
