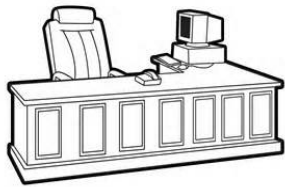

Mothers really are a profound sign of God's love for us; not just as a group, but as individuals. May God abundantly bless all the mothers in our parish community.



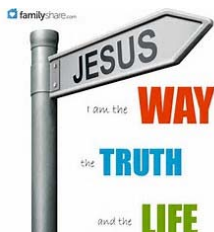

Fifth Sunday of Easter - John 14: 1-12

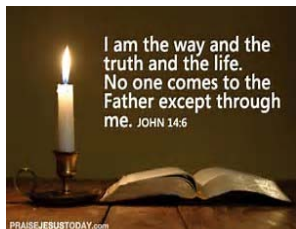
I Am the Way the Truth and the Life!



Today's reading is often read at funerals. Yet, it is a joyful reminder that there is a **home with God that awaits all of us** and the path to that home is Jesus himself. *If we want to know the path to everlasting life*

(living forever with Jesus in heaven), all we need to do is listen to his word and follow his example.

His disciple Phillip asks a question; "Master show us the Father and that will be enough." Jesus answers, to Philip's surprise, "Have I been with you for so long a time that you still do not know me." **Notice Jesus corrects him with love and kindness.** "Phillip, do you still not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? Jesus and the Father are one!



The last words of this Gospel are incredible. Listen carefully: "Whoever believes in me will do the works that I do and will do greater ones than these." How can that be?

Think about all the wonderful inventions and cures for diseases that have happened since the time of Jesus. God continues to be creative and amazing. **We who believe in God, who work in God's name, can contribute much to the world and all the people in it. YOU, each one of YOU, have so much potential.**

Pope Francis Grants Plenary Indulgence*
For Our Lady of Fatima Centennial
Jubilee Year of Fatima
Granting of Plenary Indulgence

Pope Francis has granted a plenary indulgence* opportunity for the 100th anniversary of the Fatima apparitions throughout the centennial year, from the 27th of November 2016 till the 26th of November 2017.

There are three ways to obtain the plenary indulgence, detailed in a statement from the Fatima Shrine in Portugal.

To obtain the plenary indulgence, the faithful who follow one of these three ways must also fulfill the ordinary conditions: **(1) go to Confession and Communion, (2) be interiorly detached from sin, and (3) pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, usually the Creed, the Our Father, the Hail Mary and the Glory Be.** The three ways are:

1. Make a pilgrimage to the Fatima Shrine In Portugal:

To the faithful who make a pilgrimage to the Fatima Shrine in Portugal and participate in a celebration of prayer dedicated to the Virgin. In addition, the faithful must pray the Our Father, recite the Creed and invoke the Mother of God. **OR,**

2. Pray before any statue of Our Lady of Fatima

To the faithful who visit with devotion a statue of Our Lady of Fatima **solemnly exposed for public veneration in any church, oratory or proper place** during the days of the anniversary of the apparitions, the 13th of each month from May to October 2017, and there devoutly participate in some celebration or prayer in honor of the Virgin Mary. In addition, the faithful must pray the Our Father, recite the Creed and invoke Our Lady of Fatima.

3. The elderly and infirm

To the faithful who, because of age, illness or other serious cause, are unable to get around, may pray in front of a statue of Our Lady of Fatima and must spiritually unite themselves to the jubilee celebrations on the days of the apparitions, the 13th of each month, between May and October 2017. They must also "offer to merciful God with confidence, through Mary, their prayers and sufferings or the sacrifices they make in their own lives."

*"An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints (canon 992 and Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1471)." A plenary indulgence is a complete remission of temporal punishment due to sins and is limited to one per day.

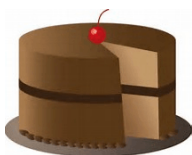

The Sacraments are Beautiful....And So Is Our Mass - Do Not Let Your Children Miss Out

If you really thought about who you are, who God is, and how much thanks you owe Him, you would want to go to Mass. The Mass would become the source and center of your spiritual life." - James Stenson



The great Bishop Fulton J. Sheen, when conducting a retreat for teenagers, once gave a talk on the meaning of the Mass. He said, "If you don't get anything out of Mass, it's because you don't

bring the right expectations to it." The Mass is not entertainment, he said. **It is worship of the God who made us and saves us.** It is an opportunity to praise God and thank Him for all that He has done for us.

If we have a correct understanding of Mass, Bishop Sheen said, it will become more meaningful for us. We will want to go to Mass. We will understand why the Mass is God's precious gift to us, and we wouldn't think of refusing that gift!



Here are two of them.....The First it is the Command of God, the third of the Ten Commandments and the second, Mass was instituted at the Last Supper by Jesus. When we celebrate the Mass, we repeat the Last Supper.

Confirmation is one of the three Sacraments of initiation into the Catholic Church (together with Baptism and Holy Communion).

Living for others

When we are confirmed. We receive a special grace by which our faith is deepened and strengthened, so that it will be strong enough not only for our own needs but for the needs of others with whom we shall try to share it. With the onset of adolescence a child begins to assume, progressively more and more, the responsibilities of adulthood. He begins to see his place in the total family picture and in the community at large.

Similarly, the confirmed Christian begins to see more clearly (or ought to) his responsibility to Christ for his neighbor. He becomes deeply concerned (or ought to) with the welfare of Christ-in-the-world – which is the Church – and the welfare of Christ-in-his-neighbor.

It is in this sense that Confirmation is a spiritual "growing up."
