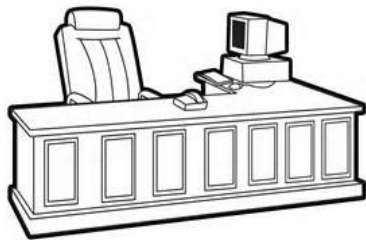

## From Fr. JC Maximilian's Desk

### "Memorial Day"

In case you are wondering why I am not at the Masses this weekend, I am down in Burlington, NC officiating at the wedding of my oldest niece, Sydney. All of my immediate family will be there. After us not being able to all get together in years, we have now done so two years in a row; last June for my installation as Pastor, and now for Sydney and Chris' wedding.

Since I cannot do so in person, I would like to take a moment to reflect on the brave women and men that we recall this weekend. While Memorial Day may be the beginning of summer barbeque season, and a sign that school is almost out for the year, the real reason for Memorial Day is to remember our fallen soldiers, sailors, and marines who made the ultimate sacrifice defending our way of life.

The United States is a rather unique country. We are not composed of peoples from the same ethnic groups. We did not develop around a king or a group of nobles. Rather the United States developed around a group of ideals, namely, that all people are endowed by God with certain inalienable rights, among them the rights of Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness. While there are many countries in the world today that also embrace those democratic, republican ideals, they all evolved to embrace them, often from some form of monarchy.

The ideals of the United States revolve around two principles. First, there are certain rights that belong to all people just because they exist. We do not believe that life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness are only rights of Americans. Rather, we believe that everyone, no matter which country they come from have those rights. They exist because God created each of us in His Image and Likeness, so everyone has a basic dignity. The second key principle of the United States is self-governance. While everyone have the same basic rights, we believe that peoples have the right to decide for themselves which form of government, and which policies those governments adopt, will best secure those inalienable rights.

When we are at our best as a nation, we put those two principles at the center of our domestic and foreign policies. Sadly, there have been times when those values, those principles have been threatened, and we have had to resort to war. War is never a good thing. At times it might be just and even necessary, but it is never a good thing. Too many of our men and women in our Armed Forces have had to fight to defend the principles of American life; the inalienable rights of all people, and the right to self-governance. They were brave and honorable, and we owe them a debt of gratitude which really can never be repaid.

We should enjoy our barbeques and time with family and friends this weekend, but let's take the time to say a prayer for the women and men that we honor this weekend. And let us appreciate that for which they gave up their lives. God Bless America!

## Reflect on the Word of Jesus Christ

May 28, 2017

### Seventh Sunday of Easter

Even though we are reading this passage six weeks after Easter, this scene takes place at the Last Supper before the crucifixion. How beautiful is His prayer for us? Think about someone who is about to die telling all the people he loves, how very much they mean to him. Jesus says how much he is praying for us. He knows he will no longer be in the world so he is thanking God for the time he has spent teaching and glorifying the Father. **He is thanking God for those who are his friends and have listened to everything he has had to say and that they believed everything he has had to say and they believe that what Jesus said about God was really true.**



This message is appropriate for the time of the Ascension and in preparation for Pentecost This passage is like his last will and testament. **We know Jesus was thinking of us before he returned to his Father. Jesus knew that his followers would face great challenges and difficulties as they continued his work. They would be tested the same way he was including being put to death. So he prayed for them that they would remain faithful to him. He prayed that they would teach people to love God and remind them that God loves them.**



**Adult:** Do I teach others about Jesus? Do I love God by being faithful to his commands? Sometimes it is a challenge.....is that really an excuse?

**Child:** Thank you Jesus for praying for us, even when you were about to be tortured and crucified. I guess my life is not so tough after all!

## Parents and Catechists Guiding Our Children

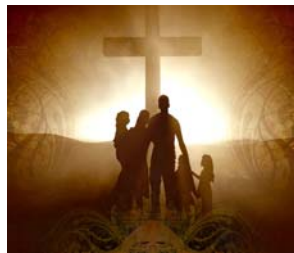


Today there is an urgent need – a need to strengthen families from within. In order to give our children a deep and lasting impression of values; they must be handed down with greater influence and

*impact. A family must be far stronger than was previously necessary. To strengthen your family:*

**Rely first of all on God's grace to help you.  
Have your priorities in line.  
Persist in your effort to keep

### The Sound of Silence

The modern world is noisy. Children frequently multi-task to television or with music in their ears—as if they are uncomfortable with silence. Yet silence is crucial to faith: “In the kingdom of God, the primary form of expression is silence”. We must be silent in order to listen to God. Students who experience opportunities for silence usually tell catechists they love it.



Parents and Catechists can encourage this appreciation for silence. A simple, “Let us pray.” Followed by silence before praying is a good place to begin. If prayer does not start until all have settled down, it will help students learn to quiet themselves. After, let the prayer sink in before beginning the next activity. It is also suggested to use silence after reading from Scripture or the textbook, since this is not a regular school book.

*Catechists should also use prayer that incorporates silence, such as guided reflection, adoration, and centering prayer, rather than only using formula prayers and prayers printed in the textbook.*
